Did You Know?

Did you know that Forrester's farm was used as a landing strip for aeroplanes in the early years? It was used until the present aerodrome was built. Here is a flash-back to the first plane that landed at Southern Cross:

"A feeling of expectancy pervaded Southern Cross on a summer's day in December 1920. Crowds of people lined the fences of a paddock between Forrester's homestead and the railway station. At strategic spots in the paddock white single bed sheets were spread. All eyes gazed into the sky in the East. Presently in the distance was heard a faint droning sound. Louder and louder it grew; eyes strained, necks ached, and the cry of 'there it is' came from Lizzie Colwell a well known identity in town. With her finger she indicated a speck in the sky.

Other eyes gradually picked it up, as slowly it drew nearer and the drone became louder and louder. At last, amidst intense excitement, the first aeroplane ever to land in Southern Cross slowly taxied to a standstill. The plane was a two seater, with a four blade propeller, and from it stepped the pilot and his passenger. The pilot was Percy Biggs an ex First World War pilot, and his passenger was C J DeGaris who was on his way to Kendenup where he was promoting a land development scheme. The plane had come from the eastern states and had stopped to refuel."

VOLUNTEER/S CURATOR POSITION



Southern Cross swimming pool

With the opening of our new swimming pool not far away, readers may be interested in the trials and tribulations experienced by earlier generations of Crossites.

Dreams of a public swimming pool started in 1902. The pipeline from Mundaring had arrived and New Zealand Gully town water supply, along South Yilgarn Road, could be turned into swimming baths. It was all talk and no action.

In 1906 the Railways were asked to hand over their disused railway dam near the town oval for use as swimming baths. A shed was erected as change room. But the water was black from manure swept in from the streets, and few used it. Two drownings did not help.

During 1939 an attempt was made for a proper swimming pool. But ratepayers were against floating a loan for a swimming pool. No one wanted to pay for it.

In 1947 another attempt to build a pool. The Road Board secretary showed his plans at a public meeting. A committee obtained quotes and discussed using mine water, but agreed that a chlorination plant was necessary. However a shortage of building materials led to the idea being shelved. The country was still recovering from war and everything was rationed.

In 1956 a public meeting was called once more to discuss a swimming pool at Southern Cross. By this stage Bullfinch had a pool per compliments of Bullfinch mine. The decision to build a pool was reached by an overwhelming majority, built on land opposite the State School, 82 feet 6 inches in length by 36 feet wide and to have a children's wading and paddling pool, change rooms, and shade houses. The pool should pay for itself.

Donations poured in. Most organisations in town held money-raising functions. A penny pile in the Club Hotel soon reached a promising level. Pennies for the pool – the copper coinage pile stood 36 inches tall. It cost a fiver for the privilege of pushing it off the counter. The pool committee soon had £240 towards their goal of £4,000.

Businessmen and farmers showed their faith by agreeing to underwrite the fund to the extent of £100 each - a total of £3,500. The guarantee was organised by John K Dixon.

Then in August 1956 a letter received from Public Works Dept stated it could not supply water for the proposed pool at Southern Cross until the capacity at No 4 pump Merredin was increased. It is impossible to accept any further demands for water east of Merredin other than for mining and farms.

It was a blow for the committee. At a lively public meeting it was decided to carry on, and to vest the proposed pool in Yilgarn Road Board. The government also urged the committee to carry on. Fund raising continued with balls and sports days and a popular girl competition. The competition raised £1,000.

In Dec 1957 the Pool Committee asked the Road Board to raise £10,000 as they were close to their goal. A letter went out to ratepayers to judge their reaction, but 77 were against the loan and only 23 in favour. The Road Board backed away. This was heartache for the Committee, a lack support from the Road Board and ratepayers alike. It decided to go into recession for 12 months, a period which stretched to 2½ years.

In 1960 a cropping programme was started, cropping 500 to 800 acres on a 30-acre unit basis, the Committee supplying seed and super and fuel. Sixteen farmers signified willingness to assist. Fund raising continued once more, and the goal was in sight.

In July 1962 a loan of £12,000 was obtained from the State Insurance Office, plus a further £8,000 contributed by the State Government. Nearly £4,000 had been raised locally and a further £3,000 would be raised that year. It was hoped to start the pool in July and finish in October.

The contract was awarded to Williams and Emery @ £17,275. Water filtration and chlorination plant of PWD design and installed by Country Towns Sewerage Works cost a further £5,000. Evacuations for the swimming pool started on 29th of October 1962.

In March 1963 the Committee reported a shortfall of £4,000 due unforeseen costs. More fund raising in the form of Wool Princess and car trials and dances helped cover this cost.

Despite a few more hick-ups the pool was eventually finished, with official opening held during November 1963, the focal point being Back to Yilgarn Weekend. It was time to celebrate, but this is another story for next issue.




