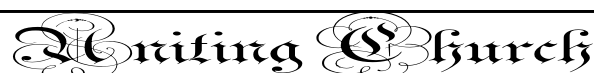

Are you a traceability ace?

Stock traceability is the first step in good biosecurity and is a key part of everyday sound farm management practices. Traceability is essential to maintain access to export markets and for food safety. It allows stock to be traced for disease or residue purposes and deters stock theft.

How are animals traced?

If you own cattle or other livestock, you must register as an owner of livestock, identify stock correctly, obtain a property identification code (PIC) for each property where you keep them and record movements to your property on the National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) database.

Cattle must have a registered identifier (brand and/or earmark) and an NLIS electronic device that enables animals to be tracked from property of birth to slaughter or export.

Don't break WA's livestock traceability chain

A weak link can break traceability and cost you market access.

Cattle Industry Funding Scheme

Are your cattle registered to your property?

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) find that half of all traceability non-compliance issues involve cattle that are not registered to the PIC they are leaving from. This breaks our traceability chain, is a potential biosecurity and market risk and can also hold up processing at the abattoir.

Don't get caught out!

Now - and not when loading the truck - is the time to check that your cattle are registered to your property by using an NLIS scanner. Scan the tags and DPIRD can assist you to run a check on the NLIS database and to update any missing movements.

Alcohol causes cancer in 7 sites of the body.

In Western Australia, one person dies every third day from alcohol-caused cancer.

Female breast

There are a number of potential ways that alcohol causes breast cancer in females, including by increasing the levels of hormones in the blood.

Despite alcohol being attributed to more than 230 breast cancer hospitalisations in 2018, only 28% of Western Australians know about the alcohol and breast cancer link.

Liver

The liver is responsible for the conversion of alcohol to acetaldehyde, which is a cell poison. Alcohol also damages the liver by causing a build-up of fat, inflammation and scarring, which can lead to liver cancer.

Alcohol is responsible for 40% of all liver cancer cases in Australia.

Mouth, throat and oesophagus

Alcohol damages the cells lining the mouth, throat (pharynx and larynx) and oesophagus as it enters the mouth and is swallowed, causing cancer in these parts of the body.

Cancers of the mouth, throat and oesophagus combined accounted for almost 45% of all alcohol-caused cancer hospitalisations in 2018.

Colon and rectum

Alcohol can cause cancer in the colon and rectum by multiple pathways, including by acetaldehyde damaging DNA and stopping cells from repairing this damage.

In 2018, alcohol-caused colorectal cancer accounted for 1 in 4 cancer-related hospitalisations in WA.

Alcohol is converted to acetaldehyde in the body.

Alcohol and acetaldehyde are Group 1 carcinogens, which means they are cancer causing to humans.

Did You Know?

Did you know the rainfall at Southern Cross for 1943 was 1793 points? At the moment it is hard to imagine Southern Cross with record rainfall, and naturally there was a large volume of water in the lakes. A few large black swans appeared on Lake Koorkoordine and then more and more began to appear until there were untold thousands. It was impossible to see the water for swans – they looked like ants on sugar, being so numerous. Towards the end of the season they disappeared, and Southern Cross had to wait until 1963 for a similar deluge, complete with swans.

Did you know the local swimming pool opened in 1963? How does the admission cost in 1963 compare to prices today:

Scholars in parties accompanied by a teacher	3 pence
Season tickets 15 years and over	£4.10.0
Season tickets children 4 to 14 years	£1.10.0
Monthly tickets 15 years and over	£1.5.0
Monthly tickets 4 to 14 years	12/6
Family tickets husband and wife	£5.0.0
Each child under 15 years	£1.10.0

Regardless, the present prices are still cheap. We are lucky to have our pool. Prior to 1963 the garden hose was the only relief from heat. Not many kids could swim. Times have changed, and for the better.

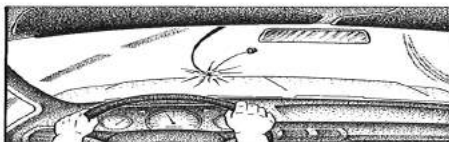
