

Influenza Vaccination Program for 2022

Annual Influenza vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been reduced circulation of influenza virus and lower levels of influenza vaccine coverage compared with previous years. With borders reopening, a resurgence of influenza is expected in 2022.

Government funded influenza vaccinations are in stock at the practice. Appointments can be booked now.

Eligibility for government funded influenza vaccines in WA are:

- · persons 65 years or older
- · children 6 months to less than 10 years
- pregnant women (any trimester)
- · Aboriginal people 6 months and older
- · individuals 6 months and older with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza, including:
 - o cardiac disease
 - o chronic respiratory conditions
 - o chronic neurological conditions
 - o Immunocompromising conditions
 - o diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - o renal disease
 - o haematological disorders
 - o children aged 6 months to 10 years receiving long term aspirin therapy.

HELP STOP FLU FROM SPREADING

Good hygiene practices, such as washing your hands thoroughly with soap and warm water can assist with reducing the risk of infection.

COVID Vaccination Winter Booster

The cold weather can make it easier for viruses to infect our bodies.

As Australia moves into winter, an additional booster dose, or 'winter dose', is recommended for people at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 who have already had their first booster dose.

If it has been at least 4 months since your first booster dose and you fit into one of the below categories, you should book an appointment to have another booster dose as soon as possible before or during winter.

Who is eligible?

- 65 years and older
- A resident of an aged care or disability care facility
- Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and aged 50years and older.
- people aged 16-64 who have:
 - Immunocompromising conditions
 - Cancer
 - Chronic inflammatory conditions (lupus, rheumatoid arthritis, crohns disease, ulcerative colitis, and similar)
 - Chronic lung disease
 - Chronic liver disease
 - Severe chronic kidney disease
 - Chronic neurological conditions
 - Diabetes
 - Chronic cardiac disease
 - People with disability with significant or complex health needs or multiple comorbidities
 - Severe obesity with BMI ≥ 40 kg/m2
 - Severe underweight with BMI < 16.5 kg/m2

People who have had COVID-19 should also wait at least 3 months before having an additional dose.

I believe this will enhance the lives of generations of locals, helping them to hear, allowing them to engage so they can be heard and helping to maintain the connection that hearing brings with friends and loved ones.

Finding Constance Janeczek

This is the story of 23 year-old Constance Janeczek, lost in the wild bush near Southern Cross over a hundred and twenty years ago.

Constance arrived at Southern Cross by train from Kalgoorlie on 20th April 1898. About 5pm next day she decided to take a stroll in the cool of the evening to visit friends a half-mile south of town. She never even put on a hat, walking along and enjoying the contrast from the heat and glare of the day.

It seemed a long way and presently it struck her it was time to return for tea. She turned but upon looking around she could see no trace of the town she had left behind. In a vague way she felt she must have strayed too far, so sought to retrace her steps. It was getting dark but starlit.

Over another ridge she went, thinking the town was on the other side, but it happened to be in the wrong direction. Then fear took over and she started to run. It was ironstone country, occasional sand patches, and bush bush. And into this she plunged, completely lost.

Back in town it was thought that she had stayed with her friends overnight, and no concern was felt for her. Another day went by before panic set in and the police were informed.

A search party set out, consisting of Joe Byrne the town mayor with his buckboard buggy and pair, Mr Richards another bushman, Constable Cassidy mounted, and two aboriginal trackers.

Her tracks were found but darkness set in. It was now Saturday night. At first light on Sunday the aboriginal trackers followed the tracks all day, and again on Monday. Grave fears were held. Three days had elapsed and the forbidding nature of the country and waterless wasteland was well known. She was doubling back and going round and round. Who would find her first, the search party, the dingoes, or the crows!

Her tracks showed she crossed the railway line twice, circled a salt lake then crossed over it. It was awful country. The party had to hack down tee-trees by driving the horses through it to get the buggy through. How she got through was a mystery. But occasionally an upturned stone on an ironstone ridge was found to give them hope.

Then some of her underclothing was found, near a hole about a foot deep and six feet long. It showed signs she had laid in it. Next day more holes, obviously scooped out by the hands of the lost girl. She must have been in agony.

By now the horses were knocked up. Five men and four horses with only 6 gallons of water between them. The horses were suffering terribly. The two aboriginal trackers and Constable Cassidy kept following the track, while the horse and buggy was driven to Strawberry Rock soak six miles away to replenish their water. A little water and whisky was left with the Constable in case the girl was found alive. They did not really expect they would.

Then her boots were found. Then an imprint of a bare heel in a sand patch. And finally, there behind a little bush she was, lying down speechless. Her singlet was tied over her head to keep the flies off, jaw dropped and fixed, eyes staring wide open, with just a movement of eyebrows to know she was alive.

She was given a teaspoon of weak whisky and water, and then a little warm tea to soften her throat. They had to be careful she did not choke while responding slowly to the warm tea. An hour later she could raise her hands to her face, and dip them in a bucket of water to cool. She still had her purse with her which contained about £20. Her hands and feet were terribly lacerated, her fingernails filled halfway down with earth.

Later the searchers said they had never seen anyone so game in their life. Grit to the backbone. She had gone into the jaws of death, so close that she had lain down to die. They admired her pluck and fortitude in circumstances more terrible than anyone can imagine. Had she been discovered an hour later her chances of recovery would have been slim.

It is estimated that during her five days sojourn in the wilderness, Constance wandered more than fifty miles. In tracking her the dingoes had followed her night and day for the same reason the crows did.

Constance was driven back to town as carefully as possible. In hospital under care of the doctor she was only allowed liquid beef tea and similar foods. Although only seven stone when in ordinary health, it was evidently all quality, and considering her ordeal she came through quite well. With her prepossessing Polish features and very fair hair, she was a striking girl.

She explained she took off her boots because her feet were tired and hot, and dug holes in the sand to cool herself. At one stage she ran after the crows as she wondered where they got their water. She did not intend to dig a grave, but was so hot and feverish she dug the big hole with sticks, scooping the earth out with her hands. She took off her underclothing and lay down, covering herself with earth and boughs. Then she felt cold and put some clothing on. She could not get her boots back on as her feet had swelled, so she set off barefooted. She was never unconscious but had no recollection of crossing the railway line. When she lay down for the last time she knew she was done, and lay there waiting for death. She heard the buggy pass but could not call out.

When it was all over it is assumed that Constance returned to Kalgoorlie. Constance, her real name Constantia Janeczek, was born 18th February 1875 in Babimost Poland. She migrated from Hamburg to Australia on 25th February 1878 with her family, and settled in Port Adelaide. From 1898 to at least 1934 she lived in Kalgoorlie, then relocated to Brisbane about 1937. She then went back to South Australia in 1938 until her death on 18th September 1945. She had three sisters and four brothers, and was naturalised Australian prior to the First World War. She never married nor had any children. Rest In Peace, Constance. You brave girl.

NOTICE OF BAITING PROGRAM FOR WILD DOGS

The Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group (EWBG) advises that from January 1st 2022 ongoing, heavy baiting programs (using 1080 meat baits) to control wild dogs will be carried out by Licensed Pest Management Technicians on Unallocated Crown Land to the east of the State Barrier Fence. In addition to 1080 baiting programs, technicians will be using foot hold traps treated with Strychnine to remove Wild Dogs that are currently impacting the livestock industry in the EWBG region.

From January 1st 2022, the standard wild dog control methods will be ongoing and this may include setting of traps and dispersing of 1080 meat baits in the groups operational area.

The poison baits will remain toxic for a number of months or until substantial rainfall is received. People are advised to take care when working within or visiting these areas.

Warning signs have been placed where applicable on Unallocated Crown Land and main access roads.

Picnic sites and recreational reserves are **not** included within the baiting program; however, baiting may take place adjacent to such areas and domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times.

1080 baiting is an integral part of the wild dog pest management program to protect livestock from death and injury caused by wild dogs.



Exercise caution to prevent your pets from being poisoned by 1080 baits.



If a wild dog is sighted, please report to the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group immediately.



If poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre (phone 13 11 26).
