Message from the CEO

The first ordinary Council meeting of the year was held on Thursday 16 February 2017. Council made the following decisions at the meeting:

✓ Council agreed to appoint the WA Electoral Commissioner to conduct the 2017 Shire Council elections as a postal election. Postal elections can only be conducted by the WA Electoral Commissioner under state legislation.

The 2015 Shire Council elections was the first election in Yilgarn using the postal election method and resulted in a voter turnout of 48%. Previous in-person elections only attracted a voter participation of approximately one-third of electors.

The postal election method is also beneficial for Yilgarn given the number of Towns within the Shire.

- The Shire has been working with Main Roads WA regarding the upgrade of the portion of Great Eastern Highway that runs through Southern Cross. We engaged consultant Engineers to prepare concept designs that meet Australian Standards and Main Roads specifications and these were endorsed by Council.
 - It should be noted that Main Roads WA are responsible for the actual traffic lanes only. The verges are the responsibility of the Shire. Given that the road needs reconstruction this represents a good opportunity to work in partnership with Main Roads to ensure a positive outcome for Southern Cross.
- ✓ The Shire has also engaged consultant Engineers to prepare concept plans for the development of the corner lot on Great Eastern Highway and Antares Street. Council also endorsed these concept plans at the meeting and a copy is included overleaf.
 - The Shire is keen to get passing motorists to enter into Antares Street to see our magnificent Town. You can see by the concept plans that we have achieved this and will be providing a quality entry statement. If caravans and motorists enter this block along Great Eastern Highway as per the current set up then we lose the ability to entice motorists travelling from the west to enter Antares Street.
- ✓ Council accepted a tender submitted by Avon Waste for the provision of kerbside general waste and recycling collections and bulk recycling collections for a five year period with a five year option of extension.

Council is required to call tenders for this service at the end of each contract. As Avon Waste are the current contractors there will be no change to the kerbside and recycling bin collections.

Shire Staff

Our previous Deputy CEO finished his employment with the Shire in January 2017. Council has agreed to change the title of this position to Executive Manager Corporate Services to better reflect the responsibilities of the position. The Shire has engaged Mr Cameron Watson to this position. Cameron is currently Deputy CEO at the Shire of Trayning and has substantial local government experience. Cameron will commence with the Shire in April 2017.

Anyone wishing to take advantage of disposing of old chemical drums will need to make a booking by phoning Manager Regulatory Services Nic Warren at the Shire office on 9049 1001 or emailing mrs@yilgarn.wa.gov.au. Make sure you have estimated the number of containers. Containers will not be accepted if you have not made a booking first.

Please remember that all drums are to be:-

- whole without caps or bungs or taps on/in the containers;
- to be clean inside and outside, including the thread around the opening and caps or bungs are not to be put back on <u>note that dye stains are accepted as they are not removed through the triple rinse process</u>;
- containers are to be cleaned via the use of one of the following methods of rinsing –
 triple rinsing,
 pressure rinsing,
 integrated rinsing;
- Containers are to be drained and dry of all residues.
- □ Note: Metal containers must be punctured 3-4 times through the bottom to assist with drainage of the container.

We take containers ranging in size from 200Lts to 500gms.

Arrangements can be made for an on-farm inspection if you have a large number of drums (500+). The above conditions still apply though.

Remember you have already paid for this service through the purchase price of drums from drumMUSTER affiliated suppliers. This program reduces the amount of landfill and reuses the plastics for manufacturing of products such as wheelie bins and bollards. It is an offence to burn plastic drums.

Community Groups are also encouraged to contact the Manager Regulatory Services Nic Warren to register their interest in holding future drumMUSTER collections where they are able to earn funds per container collected.



1901

- •WA votes to join Federation, vote swayed by t'other siders in the eastern goldfields
- Archie McIntyre starts SX Times paper. For 20 years he is a controversial figure.
- •British biograph moving pictures (silent) shown at SX for first time.

1902

- •Rabbits arrive. One displayed in shop window for benefit of doubting
- Thomas's Fire brigade formed, shed for equipment built behind present Shire office.
- •Goldfields pipeline reaches SX and water turned on. Retic to homes takes a year.

1903

- Councillor McIntyre stirs up Council, causes much in-fighting, auditors called in.
- •Several 160-acre farms taken up. Percy Forrester arrives to start a dairy.
- •Oak trees planted down the centre of main street.

1904

- Race Club moves to Greater Sports Ground near hospital, destined for all sports.
- •World champion Walter Lindrum puts on a billiard display in SX.
- •Council buys electricity from Frasers mine and invites citizens to connect up.

- •Original Club Hotel condemned by health inspector. Rebuilt as seen today.

Recently we have had several inquiries as to why the phone number to Southern Cross Police Station is diverted to either Northam or the Police Assistance Centre and community members are requesting they want to speak with local police officers 24/7 whenever they ring. Unfortunately this is not possible and does not occur at any non 24 hour Police Station in Regional WA. I will explain why below:

Local police may be busy attending other jobs or conducting inquiries / patrols either on the road or at the Police Station. As a result they are not in a position to answer phone calls or may be out of phone range therefore the station phone will be diverted. If police are off duty the station phone will always be diverted. By speaking with the officers at Northam and the Police Assistance Centre, the officer taking the call can determine if Police attendance is required and / or conduct an assessment to the priority of the job and obtain Police assistance as soon as possible. In the case of an emergency please call 000.

As you can appreciate there are only limited police based in Southern Cross and we do not have the ability to have staff sit and answer phone calls all day. I am sure almost all of you would prefer your police either charging people, investigating crime or being proactive in reducing crime and targeting drug dealers and suppliers rather than answering phone calls at a station.

It's not just the Wheatbelt: road deaths & injuries have been increasing Australia-wide

The nation experienced a 7.9% increase in road deaths during 2016 compared to 2015, and the Federal Government reports that serious injuries have increased every year since 2000, placing an extra and unnecessary burden on the economy.

Mr Lauchlan McIntosh AM, President of the Australasian College of Road Safety, reports: "Taking a national, aspirational leadership approach to road safety could save at least \$55B by 2020, and save over 2,300 lives and 50,000 serious injuries over the current decade"

"Road trauma costs are felt across the entire community, and health and social service sectors bear the ongoing costs. Benefits of reduced trauma flow through into improved national productivity, a reduction in health costs, and enhanced social well-being", said Mr McIntosh.

In Western Australia funding for road safety comes from the Road Trauma Trust Account, in other words, speed and red light camera fines. Funding is allocated for community education and larger infrastructure improvements such as the works on Toodyay Road at Noble Falls. Planned works on Toodyay Road include overtaking lanes and bridge replacement.

Nationwide, 1,300 people are killed and over 37,000 seriously injured each year. In 2016 there was a 20% increase in road deaths in WA from the 2015 number. Unconfirmed reports show that 40 people lost their lives on Wheatbelt roads in 2016.

What can be done? There is no one silver bullet to fix this problem. In WA our road safety strategy, *Towards Zero*, tells us that we need to approach the problem by focusing on the four "cornerstones" of the Safe System, listed below:

Safe Roads and Roadsides

Safe Speeds

Safe Vehicles

Safe Road Use (our driving behaviour)

Local Governments and the State Government (Main Roads WA) manage the roads and the posted speed limits on the roads, and are responsible for road safety improvements to the network.

But we the driving public of the Wheatbelt have some control over the vehicles we drive and our own driver behaviour.

The safety features in modern vehicles reduce the likelihood of crashes and improve occupant protection. For information on how safe your car is, pick up a Vehicle Safety Research Group brochure "Used Car Safety Ratings" at your Community Resource Centre, or visit the ANCAP website www.ancap.com.au

Our driving behaviour is an entirely other matter, and over the next few weeks there will be a series of articles on driver behaviour in the Despatch, aimed at informing and reminding everyone of how to stay safe on our Wheatbelt roads. Articles will include information about speed and why speeding doesn't get you there quicker, drink driving, child car restraints and seatbelt use, and the first of these is on driver distraction. 
