



WA grain, seed and hay growers invited to comment on the operations of the Grains, Seeds in Industry Funding Scheme

The Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme (IFS) Management Committee is conducting a survey of grain, seed and hay growers to discover industry views on the operations of the scheme.

The scheme uses funding authorised under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act* 2007 (BAM Act), whereby producers raise funds to tackle priority pests and diseases. The scheme is overseen by a Management Committee of growers appointed by the Minister for Agriculture and Food. All grain, seed and hay growers in the South West of the State participate in the scheme, unless they have opted out.

Your opinion is important. The IFS is industry-driven - the committee relies on input from industry to determine which pest and disease threats require action.

Bicycles

The humble bicycle played its part in opening up the goldfields. The relative flatness of the terrain and far-flung mining camps favoured the bicycle. It was speedy and cheap and needed neither water nor food.

During December 1892 two men rode their bicycles from Perth to Southern Cross in four days, thanks to Mr Dunlop and his new invention of pneumatic tyres.

Bicycles soon gained in popularity with riders taking a liking to travelling along the camel pads, which presented a firm smooth pathway. Bicycles were a great utility and used by prospectors, residents, commercial travellers, and even church ministers to travel around the parish. In later years they were also used by water supply workers to patrol the pipeline.

Several bike shops set up in Southern Cross advertising makes and models that have long since disappeared. In 1928 the principal bike shop in town was taken over by the Metzke family, and the art of spoking a wheel passed down the generations to this day.

In the cities the bicycle was popular with young ladies, much to the chagrin of the chaperone who had no means of keeping up. In a Melbourne newspaper report: 'This newspaper publishes a full page of photos of knobbly knees and bulging calves belonging to prominent local cyclists and we offer a guinea to the enthusiast who first guesses the owners. Any odds that the prize will go to one of the impetuous damsels who throng to the reserve on the days of cycle meets to throw bouquets at their heroes.'

With the discovery of Coolgardie a need for communication before the telegraph spawned a new industry. The bicycle came into its own as the fastest means of transport in the goldfields. A group of ex-Victorian bike riders set up the Cyclist Express Company operating between Southern Cross and Coolgardie. They would carry an astonishing number of expensive messages and letters, and even had their own postage stamp. Messages delivered in 30 hours with the record being 16 hours.

In addition to telegrams and letters the riders delivered important claim notices and even wages. A fit and hardy rider could earn about double the usual wage earnt on the mines.

Nevertheless the Company had trouble keeping staff. Riders did not always come back when they learnt their bicycle was ideal for specking for gold. They could cover an enormous amount of ground. The gold would glint when riding into the morning sun, particularly after rain.

Bicycles were so popular around Southern Cross that Council built cycle paths to the outlying hamlets of Greenmount and Kennyvale and Hopes Hill. These were a smooth alternative to the wheel rutted roads alongside.

Nevertheless the horse was still king of the road according to a notice posted in the Government Gazette: "No person riding a bicycle shall pass at a speed exceeding 8 miles an hour, any person riding or driving any horse or other animal. When a cyclist meets a horse or other animal, and such horse or animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount and remain dismounted till such horse or animal has passed. No person shall drive, ride or impel a machine across the intersection or round the corner of any streets or ways at a pace exceeding four miles an hour. No person shall use any bicycle unless it is licensed, the license number shall be affixed on some conspicuous part of the cycle. A lamp is to be carried between sunset and sunrise and is to be kept lighted. Every bicycle shall carry a bell which shall be used as a signal when approaching a person on foot or horseback or vehicle; penalty for breach of these by-laws twenty pounds."

Race cycle clubs were popular with the first being formed in Southern Cross during 1896. Each generation has produced outstanding riders; to name a few, James Priestly in the early 1900's, Norm Madigan during the 1930's, and Gordon Franklin in the 1950's. It was an era when most children rode a bicycle to school and the cycle club was never short of enthusiastic young riders.

Today's generation has little use for the bicycle. It is sad that the days of bicycles being essential transportation and gracing every verandah is long gone.

Who are we?

Wheatbelt Population Health is part of the WA Country Health Service- Wheatbelt Region. Wheatbelt Population Health consists of four primary health teams servicing different districts of the Wheatbelt (Avon/Central, Eastern, Southern and Western). There is a regional Wheatbelt Aboriginal Health Service and Wheatbelt Public Health Unit based in Northam.

Eastern Wheatbelt Primary Health are a team of dedicated health professionals that provide a range of free population health services to the Eastern Wheatbelt district. Staff are primarily based at the Merredin hub. Mukinbudin Nursing Post and Koorda Health Service are also part of our Primary Health team.

Staff travels across the district to deliver services. Some services offer home visits. Outreach days vary for each discipline and the frequency of visits is based on local need.

Services are FREE for all Medicare or concession card holders residing in the Eastern Wheatbelt.

Our Services

We provide a range of free services for both children and adults. These include Aboriginal Health, Allied Health, Child and Community Health Nursing, Community Midwifery, Social Work, Health Promotion and visiting specialists.



These services are delivered through in-person consultations, outreach clinics and via telehealth (video conferencing).

Referral Process

You can self-refer to the majority of our services or receive a referral from your GP.

Once received, the information in your referral is used to prioritise your appointment. This process ensures clients receive equitable access to our health services based on the severity and complexity of their assessed health needs. Prioritisation of referrals allows us to continue to provide the best possible care in a timely manner.



Enabling WA children to participate in community sport and recreation

KidSport enables eligible Western Australian children aged 5-18 years to participate in community sport and recreation by offering them financial assistance towards club fees.

Changes to KidSport

- 1. As of 1 August 2017, uniform and equipment costs will no longer be eligible for KidSport funding.
- 2. Applicants listed on a valid Health Care or Pensioner Concession card should now:
 - Apply online on the Department's website or
 - Submit a KidSport application form and a copy of the card to their local government.
- 3. KidSport no longer has referral agents.
 - Applicants not listed on a valid concession card need to meet one of the new <u>KidSport Financial Exceptions</u>.
 - If you meet an exception you can apply for KidSport through a KidSport Financial Assessor.


