### 2018 REGIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS REVIEW

The Australian Government has advised that a Regional Telecommunications Independent Review Committee has been established to undertake the above Review.

The Australian Government conducts a review into telecommunications services in regional, rural and remote parts of Australia every 3 years under Part 9B of the *Telecommunications (Consumer Protections and Services Standards) Act 1999*.

As part of the review, the Committee will consider:-

- How regional communities can maximize the economic benefits of digital technologies;
- How regional consumers use their broadband services and how they might derive further benefit from it; and
- The outcomes achieved the Mobile Black Spot Program, and examine the extent of the existing gaps in mobile coverage in regional Australia.

The Shire of Yilgarn intends to provide a submission to the Review Committee and seeks comments from residents in the Yilgarn Shire in respect to the above issues. Comments are to be submitted to the undersigned no later than **Friday, 20 July 2018**.

The Review Committee also welcomes submissions from individuals, businesses and other interested organisations. Submissions to the Review Committee close on **Sunday, 5 August 2018 at 5.00pm**. It is the intention of the Committee to conduct face to face meetings with meetings being scheduled in Kalgoorlie in the week commencing 16 July 2018.

The Regional Telecommunications Independent Review Committee's Terms of reference are outlined in an Issues Paper and a copy can be obtained from the Shire Office.

# Rusted-on bias in unjust criticism of Council rates rises

Local Governments often bear the brunt of long-held misconceptions and never more so than around their annual rates increases.

Each year many including government, the media and ratepayers look closely at the final figure of a Councils' rates increase and often pass judgement on it using inappropriate yardsticks such as the Consumer Price Index.

A few weeks back, households awoke to a headline that Councils were being told to "rein in rate increases".

It would have been a fair demand to make but for the fact that Council rate increases were admirably low and far less than other government charges.

Accompanying the article was a table that listed the rate rises of 12 metropolitan Local Governments – the highest of which was 4% and the lowest under 1% - the average was slightly less than 2.5%.

In making the claim by the Opposition to rein in rates – the Minister was commendably more circumspect – the article ignorantly compared rate rises to inflation with CPI of 1.5%.

Furthermore, the article didn't mention a more relevant context – comparing Council rates increases to other charges by government that also directly affect households.

That is, the average 2.5% Council rate rise wasn't considered in light of the average 7% increase to electricity, 5.5% for water; 5.8% for car registration or 3.7% for motor licences.

Ironically the largest of all State Government increases this year is the 10% rise for the Emergency Services Levy that is collected via Council rate notices but does not go to Local Government.

Indeed, the State Government's own statements put the increased costs to households from the recent budget at 4.8%, which is less than the 6% averaged over the past decade.

Those numbers put the average 2.5% rise in Council rates in a much fairer context, especially when you consider that increases to utility charges such as electricity will contribute to the Councils' costs.

But back to instead using inflation, or the CPI as a comparison. Whilst it may seem on the surface to be a fair comparison, it isn't. It is instead an argument that is easily understood but fatally flawed.

The factors that contribute to cost increases to Local Government, and as a consequence rates, are far more complex than comparing a cost-of-living basket of goods and services.

It is the same as saying that the price of bananas should only go up by CPI and not as a consequence of a myriad of factors including wages, cost of production and even climate.

It is hoped that ratepayers will recognise that an average Council rate rise of 2.5% is a positive achievement in an environment of much greater increases to other household charges.

Despite facing ongoing biases and misconceptions, Councils persevere in their efforts to meet community aspirations specific to their own context and for that, they are to be commended.

## Pioneers of Yilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years  
1887 and 1914

**Lukin, George:** George has the distinction of being Yilgarn's original pioneer and first white citizen, taking up a pastoral lease at Eenuin which he worked from 1874 to 1894. It was on his property that gold was first discovered in 1887, leading to the development of Yilgarn and the Eastern Goldfields.

Lukin was a boon for the prospectors with his knowledge of the country and understanding of aboriginals. His established waterholes were also a boon. Without his help, the first wave of gold seekers may not have succeeded.










## Preparing for the NDIS in WA

**The Commonwealth and Western Australian Governments have announced that the National Disability Insurance Scheme (delivered by the National Disability Insurance Agency) will be rolled out in Western Australia.**

### **What is the NDIS?**

The NDIS (National Disability Insurance Scheme) provides support for people with disability, their families and carers in Australia. The NDIS will provide all Australians under the age of 65 with a permanent and significant disability with the reasonable and necessary supports they need to live an ordinary life. The NDIS is being implemented by the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA).

### **How is the NDIS currently being delivered in WA?**

There have been two models of the NDIS operating in WA since July 2014:

- the nationally-delivered NDIS run by the NDIA
- the Western Australian (WA) NDIS (formerly known as My Way) run by the WA government.

Both NDIS models have delivered individualised support to people with disability in different locations.

The Commonwealth and WA Governments announced in December 2017 that the nationally-delivered NDIS (delivered by the NDIA) will be rolled out in Western Australia. This means there will eventually be only one NDIS delivered by the NDIA across every state and territory of Australia.

### **How will the national NDIS be different to the WA NDIS?**

The nationally-delivered NDIS and the WA NDIS are identical in the ways that count most, including taking a life time approach to support, using the same eligibility criteria and guidelines for making decisions about supports in a participant's plan.

The differences are minor and include format used for participant plans, different processes for participants to choose and engage with providers, some new terms used to describe supports in a participant's plan and variations to the prices that providers can be funded to deliver supports.

### **What does this change mean for people in the WA NDIS?**

All people in the WA NDIS will receive a letter from the West Australian government asking them to give consent to transfer to the national NDIS.

Giving consent means that people in WA NDIS can easily transfer their plan and continue to access the support they need. People who transfer from the WA NDIS to the national NDIS will experience minimal change.

Their WA NDIS supports will be transferred as closely as possible into national NDIS supports. A full NDIA plan review of participant goals, strategies and supports will occur at their review date or within 12 months after transfer.

### How will the NDIS roll out in WA?

People with disability already receiving support from WA NDIS will transfer to the national NDIS in the following time-frames:

- North East Metro and inner Wheatbelt (April to July 2018)
- South Metro (July to November 2018)
- Central South Metro (August to October 2018)
- Lower South West (September to December 2018)
- Kimberley and Pilbara (October to December 2018)

From 1 July 2018, the nationally-delivered NDIS will begin to be available to new participants in the Wheatbelt and Central South Metro regions.

From 1 October 2018, the nationally-delivered NDIS will begin to be available in the Goldfields-Esperance, North Metro regions and to new participants in the South West region.

From 1 July 2019, the nationally-delivered NDIS will begin to be available in the Midwest Gascoyne, Great Southern, Central North Metro and South East Metro regions.

From 1 July 2020, the nationally-delivered NDIS will begin to be available in Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

People currently receiving disability services from the Western Australian Government or other Commonwealth programs will transition to the NDIS at different times, depending on where they live and the type of support they are receiving.

Existing Commonwealth and State based supports will continue until you are covered by the NDIS.

### How can I get more information?

The best place to get information about the NDIS roll out is on the national NDIS website at [www.ndis.gov.au](http://www.ndis.gov.au). The website includes a short video about the NDIS roll out in WA and a questions and answers page.

Information sessions about the national NDIS will be available from January 2018 for people with disability and providers in those areas transferring from WA NDIA before July 2018. Details will be published on the events page on the NDIS website and promoted in newspapers and on social media.

### Getting started with the NDIS

For people with disability, their families and carers, the My NDIS Pathway page on the NDIS website is the best starting point for information about the NDIS, how to access the NDIS and about the planning process.

For service providers who have not already registered with the NDIS the Provider Toolkit on the NDIS website is a user-friendly online tool that takes providers through the seven steps of the Provider Pathway and includes step-by-step guides, videos and FAQs.


