ROAD UPGRADES UNDERWAY

Construction of the Parker Range Diversion Road and the Emu Fence Road Upgrade works will commence in late January 2021. The Parker Range Diversion Road is expected to be completed by early March 2021 and the Emu Fence Road works are expected to be completed by the end of April 2021.

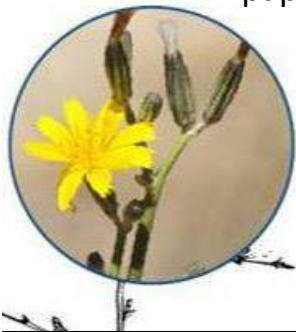


Yilgarn Local Action Group: Skeleton Weed

The Yilgarn Local Action Group would like to wish all its landholders well for 2021. Plants are out and flowering so watch out!

There have not been changes to the Skeleton Weed program for the 20/21 season, as directed by the Department of Primary Industry & Regional Development:

- **New Finds, Code 1 & Code 3** paddocks are eligible for search assistance (\$6/ha.)
- Code 2 paddocks: If you find plants, it immediately becomes a Code 1 and eligible for search assistance after a FULL search is carried out.
- All **code one** paddocks need to be searched by the **31st of December 2020**. All **other codes** need to be searched by the **31st of January 2021**.
- All property and **paddock records** to be sent in by the **15th February 2021**.
- Whilst invoices need to be sent in by March 15th, the sooner you complete paperwork, the sooner you'll be paid. :)

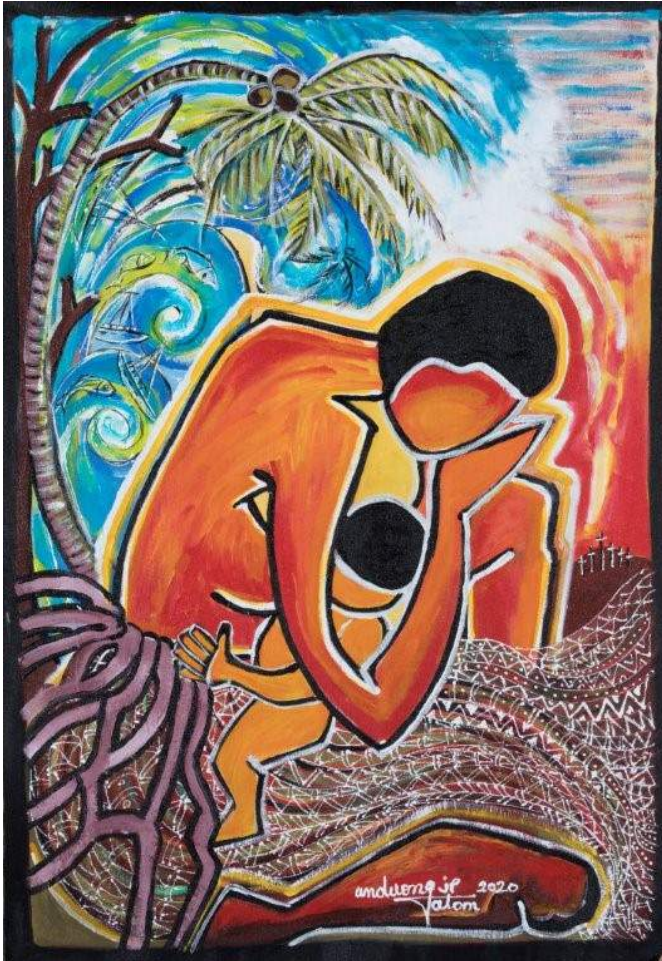

Early voting for WA State Election

Early voting (in person)

The WA Electoral Commission is working closely with the WA Department of Health to manage the risks around COVID-19 at the 2021 election, but the constantly changing situation means the WA Electoral Commission cannot plan the lead-up to and the actual election with absolute certainty. Most importantly, the WA Electoral Commission is encouraging everyone who has concerns about attending a polling place on election day to vote prior to election day, either by postal vote or at an Early Voting Centre.

At most early voting locations voting will be available for a three week period starting on 24 February and ending at 6:00pm on Friday 12 March 2021. Early voting centres will be listed on this website and will mostly be open from 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday (excluding public holidays). Early voting centres will also be open on Saturday 6 March 2021.

This is the link to the list of all Early Voting Centres throughout the state. There is one at the Merredin Community Resource Centre and also at the Northam Town Hall.

Postal voting

Early voting (by post) is made available at all State elections but is important in 2021 for those who may be uncertain about casting their ballot in person. An application for a postal vote can be completed electronically on the [Commission's website](#) or a printed form can be requested by contacting the Commission on 13 63 06 and selecting option 2. Ballot papers will be posted to electors from Monday 22 February 2021. If posted by the elector on or before polling day, completed postal packages can be accepted via mail until 9:00am on the Thursday following polling day.

Voting early at every election

In some circumstances, you may be eligible to apply for registration as a general early voter. This means that ballot papers are automatically sent to you (by post) after an election has been announced and ballot papers have been printed.

Eligibility

An elector can apply to be registered as a general early voter if the elector:

- lives more than 20 kilometres by the nearest practicable route from the nearest polling place
- is a patient in a hospital or similar institution
- due to serious personal illness is physically unable to travel to a polling place
- is caring for a person who is seriously ill or infirm
- is aged 70 years or over
- is registered as an overseas elector
- is registered as a silent elector or
- is an elector who because of religious beliefs, or membership of a religious order is precluded from attending a polling place for all or most of the hours of polling.

To register as a general early voter you need to meet the eligibility requirement and complete the required [general early voter form](#) (PDF 1.05 MB - https://www.elections.wa.gov.au/sites/default/files/content/documents/General_Early_Voter_Registration.pdf). This form can be submitted at any time.

Are you interested in the biosecurity of Western Australia's agricultural industries?

Western Australian producers and other stakeholders in the dairy, beef, grain/seed, hay, sheep and/or goat industries and respective supply chains are invited to apply for positions on Industry Funding Scheme Management Committees and/or the Industry Funding Scheme Review Panel.

[Industry Funding Schemes](#) enable agricultural industries to raise funds to address priority pests and diseases at a whole-of-industry level.

The schemes are industry-driven and overseen by a Management Committee made up of producers and others with appropriate industry knowledge and expertise.

The Review Panel reviews applications for payments made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations, where the applicant is dissatisfied with the outcome of their application and requests a review.

The Minister for Agriculture and Food appoints members for a period of up to three years. The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development provides support to the schemes, committees and panel.

During 2021, there will be vacancies on the following Management Committees:

- [Cattle Industry Funding Scheme](#) (4 vacancies)
- [Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme](#) (4 vacancies)
- [Sheep and Goat Industry Funding Scheme](#) (4 vacancies)

From 1 July 2021, there will be three vacancies on the [Industry Funding Scheme Review Panel](#).

The Management Committees meet quarterly on dates agreed by members. The Review Panel convenes when a review of an application for payment, made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations, is requested.

Members of the Management Committees and Review Panel are remunerated, including sitting fees and travel expenses.

More information, including the terms of reference and selection criteria, is available on the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website at agric.wa.gov.au. Search for 'Committee membership EOIs'.

The Western Australian Government is committed to ensuring diversity on Government boards and committees and, in particular, increasing the representation of women to 50 per cent.

Road Trauma Support WA

Supporting those who have been impacted by road trauma across WA



When you're ready to talk, we're here to help

Here to help

Every year in WA thousands of people are impacted by road crashes.

Road Trauma Support WA provides information, support and counselling to anyone in WA who has been affected by a road crash.

We support those who have been involved in and/or injured in a road crash, their families, friends and carers, those who have witnessed a crash or are first on the scene, first responders and those who may have caused a road crash to occur.

Our services

Our specialised fact sheets dealing with the impact of road trauma provide additional information and support and provide some tools that can help you cope in the aftermath of a road crash.

We provide specialised trauma and bereavement counselling:

- in person or via telephone or video call
- no referral needed
- no limit on number of sessions
- no timeframe for when incident occurred
- free service

Our specialised training and education workshops sessions support organisations, including emergency service personnel (paid and voluntary) whose staff may be exposed to road trauma as part of their work.

When to get help

It's important to recognise that you've been through an extremely stressful event and need to give yourself time and space to acknowledge what has happened.

The majority of people will recover from exposure to trauma with the care and support of family and friends. However some may experience ongoing, distressing symptoms that can prevent them from enjoying a normal life.

Some signs you may need to seek professional help can include:

- recurrent nightmares
- phobias, anxiety and flashbacks that last more than a few weeks
- trouble functioning at home or at work
- your relationship or friendships are suffering
- thoughts of harming yourself or others

A trained professional, such as a psychologist, counsellor or medical professional can help you cope with the trauma in a safe, confidential and non-judgemental manner.

Helping your recovery

There are a number of simple ways you can help your recovery following exposure to road trauma:

- spend time with people who care about you
- maintain a normal routine as much as possible
- ensure you are sleeping, eating well and exercising where and when possible
- avoid using alcohol and/or drugs to numb your feelings
- talk to someone you trust about what you have been through
- book an appointment with one of our trained counsellors, a General Practitioner, Employee Assistance Provider or other trained professional

Referral pathways

Road Trauma Support WA is a self-referral service meaning you can contact us directly on 1300 004 814 to book an appointment.

You can also refer a friend or family member via a third party referral however we require their signature as consent to contact them.

Referrals are also accepted from General Practitioners, the Insurance Commission of Western Australia, Health Professionals, Social Workers and First Responders.

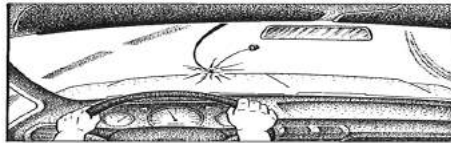
