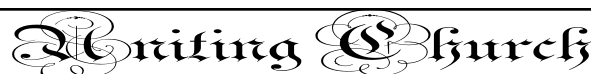

Community Funding Program 2021 / 2022

The “**Community Funding Program**” will open on Monday 4 October 2021.

Objectives of the funding project are:

- To provide a source of funding for non-profit community organisations operating within the district.
- To assist community organisations in maximising their future development.
- To provide an impartial means by which community organisations can access Council funds.

Applications for the following categories are invited:

A - Essential equipment/capital items (up to \$2,000)

Types of equipment:

- Ground maintenance equipment
- Sporting equipment
- Office equipment
- Minor plant equipment

B - Training & Travel Assistance for local officials/office bearers (up to \$500)

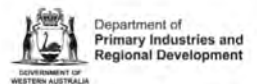

Did You Know?

Did you know that gold mining in Yilgarn has experienced four booms and busts, spaced about 25 years apart? Mining activity is dictated by the price of gold. Originally the price was set by the government and tied to the pound sterling. Later it was tied to the American dollar. Now the price of gold floats on the world market. When gold values drop below production costs, the mines close. An increase in the gold price, usually caused by world events, leads to the old mines being reworked and lower grade dirt becomes profitable. After a few years production costs will again outweigh values, and the cycle repeats. There is still gold left in Yilgarn but at a depth which makes mining unprofitable at today's price. A glance at Google Earth will show the Yilgarn gold belt starts near Mount Magnet and ends near Ravensthorpe, popping up to the surface every few miles, where it has been mined. Between Southern Cross and Marvel Loch there are 20 old mines along the gold belt, mostly worked out by previous generations.

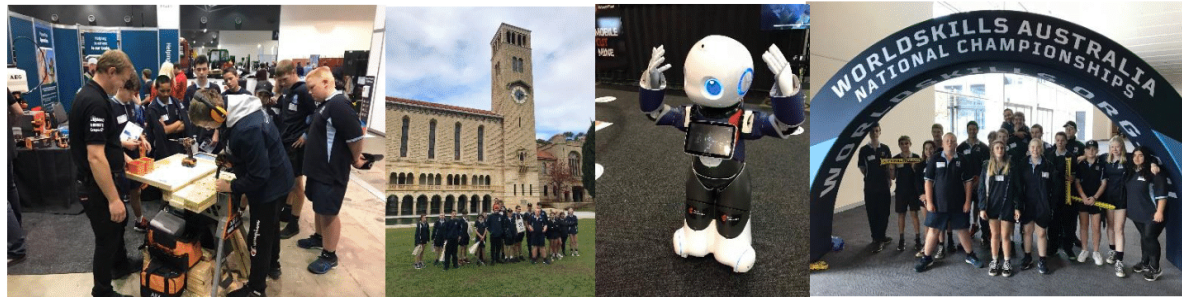

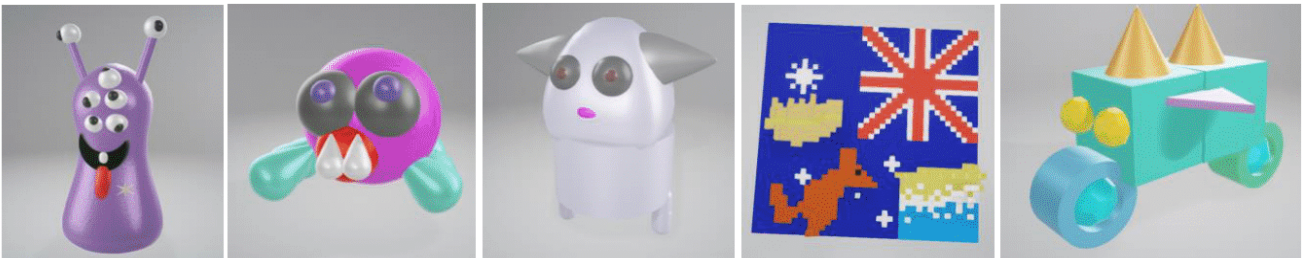

How to check in on someone

Helping others and providing support can make a difference for someone who is having problems and going through a tough time. If you think someone you care about isn't going so well, try the following tips on how to support them and continue to check in on them.



Talk

For most people, just asking if they are okay and listening can make a difference.

By simply being there for someone, they can feel less alone and more supported to open up and talk about how they are really feeling.

Asking open ended questions that require a response is a good way to start the conversation.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- How are you going? What's been happening in your life lately?
- You don't seem quite yourself lately, is something bothering you?
- You seem upset or worried, what's going on? Can I help with something?
- I've noticed you're not going out much lately, anything going on?



Do an activity together

Activities create conversation. Find an opportunity during everyday life activities to start the conversation and ask them how they are really feeling. Try doing activities together such as:



GOING FOR A WALK



GOING TO AN EVENT TOGETHER



GOING FOR A COFFEE OR A MEAL



Listen

Just being there for someone and offering a listening ear can make a difference.

1. Show them that you care and are here to listen to them.
2. Have patience, let others talk and don't judge.
3. Be reflective by repeating what they have said.
4. Keep calm and accept that they may disagree with you.

THERE WERE PLENTY OF **BRIGHT YOUNG MINDS AT MINERAL RESOURCES'** (MRL) KOOLYANOBING OPERATION LAST WEEK AS YEAR 9 AND 10 STUDENTS AND TEACHERS FROM SOUTHERN CROSS DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL DROPPED BY TO **LEARN ABOUT THE BENEFITS OF A CAREER IN MINING.**

MRL brought the ten students and two teachers to Koolyanobbing for the day, where they enjoyed a site tour, learned about the different roles and jobs available and found out what iron ore mining is all about.

Site General Manager, Scott Oakley, greeted the students with an Acknowledgment of Country and outlined essential site information, before the students were taken to a presentation and tour by Haulage Superintendent Jay Johnston. The students learnt about the different processes that take place when iron ore is mined, and enjoyed a tour of the different trucks on site.

The group also stopped by the MRL R U OK? ice cream truck that was on site that day.

Crushing Manager, Joel Evans, then took the students on a tour of a fixed plant, through the electricians' workshop and to meet the people who are responsible for different roles in the process of crushing iron ore.

After lunch the students went to the AMG-K1 workshop, where AMG Superintendent Scott Telha provided a tour of the workshop, machinery and the tyres used on the trucks and offered insights on his career progression to a superintendent. Yilgarn Onboarding Coordinator, Lauren Kenny, also shared details of her MRL career story and the additional study she's undertaking to further her mining career.

Southern Cross District High School Deputy Principal Luke Serra said the 'day in the life of a miner' excursion was tremendously valuable and informative.
