

SKELETON WEED SUPPORT OFFICER

(Casual)

The Shire of Yilgarn invites applications for the position of Skeleton Weed Support Officer, which is a casual role. The position will involve 35 hours per fortnight (as required), with flexible working arrangements available. The primary responsibilities of the position are:

- Providing administrative support for the Yilgarn Local Action Group;
- Provide reception support for Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development;
- Assist affected landholders meet their skeleton weed program requirements;
- Assist Yilgarn Local Action Group with winter treatment of affected sites;
- Collect and maintain information related to Skeleton weed searching and treatment;
- Assist in preparing reports and financial acquittal/budget applications.

While no previous experience working with skeleton weed is required, a basic knowledge of the plant, control program and the Yilgarn area would be beneficial.

The position is fully funded by the Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme, and therefore is reliant on grant funding to continue each year and operates out of the DPIRD Office located on Arcturus Street, Southern Cross.

Council operates under the Shire of Yilgarn Enterprise Agreement 2021, salary and conditions will be in accordance with this agreement. This casual position is classified as a Level 5 and will be applied on a pro-rata basis. The salary package for a level 5 position is as follows:

- \$29.15 per hour
- 25% Casual Loading

The Yilgarn Local Action Group would like to wish all its landholders well for 2022. Plants are out and flowering so watch out!

There have not been changes to the Skeleton Weed program for the 21/22 season, as directed by the Department of Primary Industry & Regional Development:

- New Finds, Code 1 & Code 3 paddocks are eligible for search assistance (\$6/ha.)
- <u>Code 2 paddocks:</u> If you find plants, it immediately becomes a Code 1 and eligible for search assistance after a FULL search is carried out.
- All code one paddocks needed be to be <u>searched</u> by the <u>31st of</u>
 December 2021. All other codes need to be searched by the <u>31st of</u>
 January 2022.
- All property and paddock records to be sent in by the 15th February 2022.
- Whilst invoices need to be sent in by March 15th, the sooner you complete paperwork, the sooner you'll be paid. :)

Díd you know?

Did you know it was the condensers that saved the goldfields from water shortage in the early years? Fresh water, or lack of it, was the bane of early Southern Cross and other finds. Although huge reservoirs of salt water existed under the numerous salt lakes, in its natural form the lake water was seven times saltier than the sea. Finding a way to utilise this water saved the goldfields. Condensers were designed to turn salt water into fresh by boiling. They were little more than overgrown kettles. Boiling water in tanks produced steam, which was diverted through a series of pipes to drip out at the end as drinking water. In effect a distilling plant. William Cameron built the first condenser in Southern Cross during 1889 with the aid of a handyman. It was erected near his store where the Palace Hotel now stands. For the next 13 years condensed water augmented supplies available from soaks and dams. Every summer there was a water shortage. Baths were a forgotten luxury. Most lakebeds surrounding Southern Cross were graced with condensers. Individuals who sold their water to the public did a roaring trade. The railways owned their own condenser, as did the Government. By setting a fair price for their water, the Government helped regulate the price charged by private individuals. Nevertheless exploitation and overcharging was rife.

During times of shortage it was not uncommon to queue for half a day to obtain a waterbag full. Operators used carts to hawk their product around town. Condensed water was used mainly for drinking and cooking, the less expensive dam water given to animals and used for washing clothes and bathing. Condensed water was not particularly palatable, but better than the muddy liquid available from dams. Condensed water played havoc with babies by lifting the lining off their delicate stomach. It was referred to as 'condenser belly.' Condensing sites stood out. During daylight the mounds of salt accumulated from the boiled water would dazzle in the sunlight, and at night the fires could be seen for miles. The condensers burnt for 24 hours as the operators set about 'cooking water.' They were built on the edge of lakes, with a well or depression sunk nearby in the lakebed to supply the salt water. Even if no water was visible on the surface it could be located at a shallow depth by digging. Salt build up inside the condensers was an ongoing problem, and on Sundays the fires were withdrawn so as to enable a man to crawl inside and chip it off.

Most of the mines had their own condensers, using back-heat off their steam engines which powered the machinery. Their salt water was obtained from the shafts, with 100 gallons condensing down to 60 gallons of fresh. The boilers needed fresh water, while the crushing plant could operate on salt water. Mine workers were allocated 4gallons per day and it was termed 'washing water.' The condensers devoured an enormous amount of firewood. This led to large areas surrounding goldfields townships including Southern Cross being denuded of vegetation. It is only in recent years that the Green Belt around town has grown again, thanks to our Shire.

Did you know that remains of condenser sites are still visible on Southern Cross lakes? For those interested in a treasure hunt, try finding the sites of ash heaps, stone fire places, and depressions of former wells. To start you off I will give you a few tips:

- 1) Opposite the old cemetery. This was one of the largest and at one time belonged to Harold Cocking. The road to Coolgardie passed here.
- 2) On the lake at the rear of the hospital. At one time owned by Turnbull. A photo of this condenser is available at the museum. The original road to Coolgardie passed here.
- 3) Near the hospital buildings. This may have been owned by the hospital.
- Four condenser sites are visible along the Koolyanobbing road close to town.
- 5) Near the previous rubbish tip. A large earth ramp can be seen as well as channels dug into the lakebed. This was the Government condenser and more substantial than the others.
- 6) In the lake opposite the sports oval. This is an excellent specimen with some timberwork still intact today.
- 7) Alongside Owen McMahon's house on the east side of town, used in his aerated water factory. The Wesley family now owns this property.

Undoubtedly a number of condensers were spaced along the west side of Lake Polaris, running parallel with the town, but have since been covered over as buildings and earthworks encroached into the lake. Although much has been made of the Coolgardie Water Scheme, it was the condensers that saved the goldfields from being abandoned in the early years.

Problems peeing

Find Cancer Early in 2022

Cancer Council WA is asking people over 40 years of age in regional WA to make their health a priority in 2022 by knowing the two different ways to detect cancer early. Cancer

Council WA's Wheatbelt Regional Education Officer Kaylor Andrews said one way is to be cancer symptom aware and visit your local medical clinic if symptoms exist.

"Research indicates regional West Aussies tend to present at the GP at a later stage for a number of reasons including because they can be more optimistic, laid back and sometimes make excuses for not seeking help, which may contribute to later stage cancer diagnoses," Kaylor said.

"The Find Cancer Early program is designed to tackle some of these relaxed attitudes and motivate people with symptoms to push past the barriers and seek medical advice as soon as possible."

"The program also aims to inform regional West Aussies of the symptoms of the five most common cancers – prostate, breast, skin, bowel and lung cancer – which make up around 60 per cent of new cancers diagnosed in WA each year."

Kaylor recommended regional people could be symptom aware in 2022 by printing off the cancer symptom checklist from www.findcancerearly.com.au/ and putting it on the bathroom mirror or fridge as a regular reminder.

Cancer Council WA recommends visiting your GP, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker if you experience any of the below symptoms:

- blood in your poo, blood in your pee or you've coughed up blood, even just on one occasion
- Or for more than four weeks you've noticed problems peeing, unexplained weight loss, an unusual pain, lump or swelling anywhere in your body, shortness of breath, a persistent cough, or changes to your bowel habits, including runny poo, pooing more often or constipation

"Whatever the outcome, it's best to find out what's going on early and get onto any recommended treatment. If it turns out to be nothing you have peace of mind and can save yourself the uncertainty of the 'wait and see' approach," she said.

"The other way to detect cancer early is to participate in the three national screening programs. It's important to remember the national screening program tests such as the National bowel cancer screening program 'poo testing' kit, BreastscreenWA mammograms and cervical screening are designed for people who aren't experiencing symptoms."

"If you do not have any symptoms and you are eligible, please participate in Australia's free national cancer screening programs (available for bowel, breast, and cervical cancer)."
