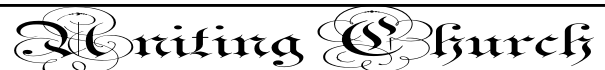

Bush Fires Act 1954

Notice of Extension to Prohibited Burning Period

It is considered that the current seasonal conditions pose a significant risk of bush fire.

As such, under the powers delegated to the Chief Executive Officer by the Shire of Yilgarn Council and as per Section 17(7) of the Bush Fires Act 1954, the prohibited burning period has been extended until the 23:59 hours on the 28 February 2022.

This decision has been made in full consultation with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer of the Shire of Yilgarn.

Yilgarn Local Action Group: Skeleton Weed

The Yilgarn Local Action Group would like to wish all its landholders well for 2022. Plants are out and flowering so watch out!

There have not been changes to the Skeleton Weed program for the 21/22 season, as directed by the Department of Primary Industry & Regional Development:

- **New Finds, Code 1 & Code 3** paddocks are eligible for search assistance (\$6/ha.)
- Code 2 paddocks: If you find plants, it immediately becomes a Code 1 and eligible for search assistance after a FULL search is carried out.
- All **code one** paddocks needed to be searched by the **31st of December 2021**. All **other codes** needed to be searched by the **31st of January 2022**.
- All property and **paddock records** should have been sent in by the **15th February 2022**.
- Whilst invoices need to be sent in by March 15th, the sooner you complete paperwork, the sooner you'll be paid. :)

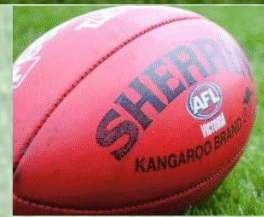

Recording a loved one's life history is a moving experience but even more so when it could be information that saves their life. What might feel like small details, such as an old home address or a favourite pastime, represents valuable information to Police Officers in the race against time if your loved one goes missing.

The launch of Safe & Found WA offers peace of mind that Western Australia Police Force has a new lifeline for West Australians concerned about someone that may be at risk of wandering.

WA Police partnered with Australia Medic Alert Foundation to create Safe & Found WA in response to an increase in searches for persons living with dementia, autism and cognitive impairments. Police conducted 170 searches for people living with dementia in 2021, a sharp increase of over double the searches in previous years. Searches for missing persons are always time and resource intensive and despite best efforts of the Police and search partners, can still end in tragedy.

Safe & Found WA assists Police in a search with immediately accessible detailed personal information about the missing person, compiled ahead of time and stored securely. This information will include former home or work addresses, habits and behaviours or perhaps where they may have been found in a previous search. A comprehensive description and a current photo will accompany this information, ensuring that WA Police have the information required to immediately broadcast a Be on the Lookout (BOLO) for a missing person to police officers and the wider community with the Emergency Alert system.

Forget Me Not Member Café founder Angi McCluskey's husband went missing from a picnic in Kings Park several years ago and was missing for over six hours before fortunately being found safe and well thanks to Police and Emergency Services.

"It's one of those things that when it actually happens you're not thinking of what he used to do, or where he used to go, or what's his favourite place in the world. You're just trying to find him."

Membership to Safe & Found WA gives you peace of mind that your detailed information and a recent photograph will be collected and securely stored ahead of time, ready to be accessed immediately by Police in the event that you go missing.

A Safe & Found ID bracelet is also included with your membership, ensuring that if you appear disoriented, hurt or confused you can be identified easily and returned safely home.

Join now for \$99 + P&H - Your First Year Bundle includes set-up of your secure Safe & Found profile and a complimentary custom-engraved Safe & Found ID bracelet.

Step 1 – Setting up a myGovID account

If you already have a myGovID set up, skip to Step 2

1. You will need any **TWO** of the following documents and access to your email.

Driver's licence *Medicare card* *Birth certificate*
Passport (with visa if non-Australian) *Citizenship certificate*
Immigration Card

2. On your phone download the **myGovID** app

3. Open the myGovID app – select whether to allow notifications or not

4. Select **Create a myGovID**

5. Swipe through the four info screens, then tap on **Start now**

6. Accept the Terms of use

7. Enter an email address – you can use the same email address you use for myGov

8. Tap on **Get code**

9. Access your email and note the myGovID verification code

10. Enter the code in the myGovID app – then tap **Next**

11. You may be asked to use your phone's Fingerprint or Facial recognition function for added security.

Accept if wished – or tap **Not now**

12. Enter a password according to the instructions on screen – then tap **Next**

13. Enter your details and tap **Done** – you can ignore or tap X on the warning about Covid vaccination

14. You will now need to prove your identity using **TWO** of the documents listed above.

NOTE: the system appears to ask for a third form of ID, this is not essential, but can be entered if desired

15. Tap on the first document – e.g. Driver's licence

16. Scan your licence using your phone's camera or enter the details manually.

(If there are scanning errors, either rescan or tap **Edit** and correct these)

17. Tick the consent box and tap **Submit**

18. Tap on the second document – e.g. Medicare

19. Scan your card using your phone's camera or enter the details manually.

(If there are scanning errors, either rescan or tap **Edit** and correct these)

20. Enter your date of birth

21. Tick the consent box and tap **Submit**

22. Your myGovID is now set up – you will now set up your ServiceWA account

Step 2 – Setting up a ServiceWA account (your phone must have either Android 10 or higher, or iOS 14 or higher)

If you already have a ServiceWA account set up, skip to Step 3

1. On your phone download the ServiceWA app
2. Open the ServiceWA app – select whether to allow notifications or not
3. Tap Next
4. On the Consent page scroll down and tap I agree
5. Tap Log in to Service WA
6. On the Log in screen, you will see the myGovID as the preferred option – tap Log in
7. You will be redirected to the Digital Identity website
8. Under myGovID, tick Remember my choice
9. Tap on Select myGovID
10. Enter the email address used for myGovID
11. Tap Remember me then tap Login
12. You will be shown a four digit code
13. Open the myGov ID app, enter the code and tap Accept
14. Open the ServiceWA app
15. On the Your consent screen scroll down – tick the Yes and don't ask me again box
16. Tap Consent
17. Tap Consent again
18. Add your mobile number then tap Next
19. Confirm your mobile number
20. Enter the confirmation code and tap Next
21. Tap Next again
22. Tap on Enable SafeWA
23. Tap on I agree then tap Next
24. Scroll down and tap I agree
25. Tap OK to allow camera access
26. Your ServiceWA account is now set up – you can now link your vaccination certificate

Step 3 – Linking your vaccination certificate

1. In the ServiceWA app, tap on Certificate
2. Tap on Import through your myGov account
3. Login to myGov if required
4. Tap Continue
5. Tap on Medicare
6. Tap on View proof of vaccinations
7. Tap on View history
8. Tap on Share with check in app
9. Tap on Share next to ServiceWA
10. Tap Accept and share
11. Tap Next
12. Scroll down and tap I Agree
13. Tap Save Certificate
14. Everything should now be set up

Did you know?

Did you know that water from the Goldfields Water Scheme was turned on at Southern Cross in September 1902? At 10am Monday 3rd Council turned on the water at the standpipe on the corner of Phoenix and Sirius streets. It was a red-letter day. The paper claimed that the grand opening was a farce. Instead of waiting for a Government dignitary to carry out the function, Mayor Montgomery gathered up a few of his cronies so as to make it official, and turned on the water himself. Pictures of this historic event are on display at the Museum.

The first customer to buy 100 gallons for the price of one shilling was local resident Joe Payne. The shilling was duly mounted on a board for display in the Council Office. It was referred to as 'mounting the bob' (bob being a slang expression for one shilling). Before relinquishing office as mayor, Montgomery took possession of 'the bob' and only returned it under risk of prosecution. (Whatever happened to it since?) The water had reached Southern Cross and the government considered it had done its job. Reticulation and collection of charges was now the responsibility of the local Council, which Council set to and accomplished at enormous cost with borrowed money. It left the town poor for several years and delayed other works including installing electricity. Ironically the government then relented and took over the full role at Coolgardie and Kalgoorlie.

Southern Cross was the only town which paid its own way. Mayoress Mrs Snook, turned on the water to houses on 29th January 1903. Due to demand, another standpipe was erected outside Council Office and another erected at the end of railway town for the benefit of Hopes Hill residents. It was a new look Southern Cross after the arrival of the pipe with plenty of water. Gardens flourished and lawns were planted with competitions held to see who had the best. People could even have a bath. Several farmers near town put on the water to grow produce for sale in the shops.

For the next ten years the Council continued to administer water distribution at Southern Cross, buying water from the Government and on-selling to townspeople. It was intended as a means of raising revenue but it did not work out. During 1912 the function was handed over to the Goldfields Water Supply, which has continued the role to this day.

There is a phone for you to access phone self-service or speak to an agency service officer.

If you would rather use your mobile phone or tablet, we have free Wi-Fi available 24/7.

You do not need a password so you can get online straight away.

You can also use the Wi-Fi to download and install the Express Plus mobile apps.

Our staff will even certify your identity documents for you.

So next time you need to do some government business, drop in and see us.

We are open Monday to Friday, 8.30am—12noon, 1.00pm to 4.30pm at the CRC building on Canopus Street, Southern Cross.

How to check in on someone

Helping others and providing support can make a difference for someone who is having problems and going through a tough time. If you think someone you care about isn't going so well, try the following tips on how to support them and continue to check in on them.



Talk

For most people, just asking if they are okay and listening can make a difference.

By simply being there for someone, they can feel less alone and more supported to open up and talk about how they are really feeling.

Asking open ended questions that require a response is a good way to start the conversation.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- How are you going? What's been happening in your life lately?
- You don't seem quite yourself lately, is something bothering you?
- You seem upset or worried, what's going on? Can I help with something?
- I've noticed you're not going out much lately, anything going on?



Do an activity together

Activities create conversation. Find an opportunity during everyday life activities to start the conversation and ask them how they are really feeling. Try doing activities together such as:



GOING FOR A WALK



GOING TO AN EVENT TOGETHER



GOING FOR A COFFEE OR A MEAL



Listen

Just being there for someone and offering a listening ear can make a difference.

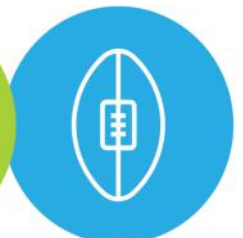
1. Show them that you care and are here to listen to them.

Regional domestic violence service sees rise in calls from people experiencing emotional abuse Western Australia's only specialist family and domestic violence service for people living in regional, rural and remote areas has expanded its hours as calls about emotional abuse steadily rise.

DVassist's telephone and 'silent' webchat counselling is now available from 7am to 12midnight, seven days a week, to ensure expert, confidential support and advice is available when its needed most.

Chief Executive Officer, Greg Hebble, said an increase in abandoned calls outside of its previous 10am to 10pm operations had prompted the extended hours and was a sobering reminder that family and domestic violence doesn't just impact families 9 to 5.

"We know that people living in regional WA face unique challenges when it comes to accessing family and domestic violence support, so it is important that we continue to evolve our service to better meet their needs," he said.

"Physical isolation, limited local resources and the fear of being the subject of gossip in a small community can stop those living outside the metropolitan area getting help and we have to remove those barriers."

Mr Hebble said while DVassist deals with all types of relationship abuse, its clinical team is reporting that emotional abuse now forms part of almost every counselling conversation.

"Emotional abuse doesn't leave bruises and it is often difficult to show proof that it is occurring," he said.

"But it destroys your self-esteem and can leave you feeling anxious, worthless, and even depressed, and that is equally as harmful as physical abuse."

Mr Hebble said the DVassist website features a two-minute quiz to help people identify if they are in an emotionally abusive relationship.

“While the quiz doesn’t take the place of professional advice, it can be the first step in recognising that you might be at risk and need to seek support,” he said.

DVassist says if you associate the following with an intimate partner you may be in an emotionally abusive relationship:

- Intimidation
- Humiliation
- Verbal aggression
- Erratic mood swings
- Doing things to punish you
- Gas lighting – twisting situations to make it seem like it’s your fault
- Blaming you
- Making you feel guilty.

“No matter how normal it may seem, emotional and psychological abuse are not acceptable,” said Mr Hebble.

“When you’re ready to talk, we’re here to listen.”
