

Share what living in the Wheatbelt is like with doctors of the future

One hundred medical students will be coming to the Wheatbelt in March 2023. During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and participate in community activities.

We need you to provide real-life experiences that will give them an understanding of what it is like to live in the Wheatbelt and perhaps inspire them to become rural doctors.

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life or the Wheatbelt.

By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are more likely to explore rural career opportunities.

Some students continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs, some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine, and some students are now doctors in the Wheatbelt and other parts of rural/remote WA and Australia.

Don't cut corners with **asbestos**

Asbestos waste and disposal – do things the right way

Illegal asbestos disposal is a crime. This includes the improper disposal of asbestos in kerbside or skip bins.

- To prevent exposure, all asbestos waste must be disposed of at a landfill site licensed to accept asbestos waste.
- There are strict laws relating to illegal disposal and heavy fines apply.
- 97% of the Australian population lives within 40 minutes' travel from a waste facility that accepts domestic asbestos waste.
- Asbestos waste must be double-wrapped in 200-micron thick plastic, sealed and labelled for disposal and the licensed facilities often require prior notice or bookings to be made.
- It is not recommended that you handle, remove or dispose of asbestos yourself. It is easier, safer and often cheaper to get a professional to do the job for you.
- Asbestos causes cancer and if not disposed of properly, it puts council workers, and the community's health at risk.
- A licensed asbestos removalist has the training and the equipment needed for the safe handling, removal and disposal of asbestos. They will usually include the cost of disposing the asbestos waste legally with the cost of removal.
- Licensed asbestos removalists are listed on your Work Health and Safety Regulator's website (WorkSafe or SafeWork in your state or territory).

Over a third of those who have encountered asbestos admitted to illegal and dangerous disposal – mostly in their own or a neighbour's household bin.


- An estimated 4,000 Australians die annually from asbestos-related diseases. This is nearly four times the annual road toll.
- Approximately 700 people die annually from the aggressive cancer mesothelioma which is caused by exposure to asbestos.

- Asbestos was completely banned in Australia in 2003 (December 31, 2003).
- An estimated 6,000 tonnes of asbestos are illegally dumped every year with around \$11.2 million per annum in clean-up costs.
- The World Health Organization says there is no known safe minimum level of exposure to asbestos fibres.
- You cannot see asbestos fibres – they are invisible to the naked eye.

Many homes built before 1990
contain asbestos.

A. Exterior

Roof sheeting, gutters, downpipes, ridge capping, imitation brick cladding and lining under eaves.

B. Bathroom, toilet and laundry

Wall and ceiling panels, vinyl floor tiles and backing for wall tiles.

C. Kitchen

Wall and ceiling panels, backing for splashbacks, vinyl floor tiles, backing of vinyl flooring and insulation in stoves.

D. Living areas

Wall and ceiling panels, carpet underlay and insulation in domestic heaters.

E. Backyard

Fences, garden sheds, garages, carports, outdoor toilets, dog kennels, buried and dumped waste materials.

F. Other areas

Backing of electrical switchboards, insulation in roof cavities, hot water pipe insulation, textured paint and plaster patching compounds.

Federal Member for Durack, The Hon Melissa Price MP invites agricultural organisations to apply for funding via the Future Droughts Fund: Extension and Adoption of Drought Resilience Farming Practices Grants Program.

“These grants will enable farmer groups, agricultural businesses, and organisations to adapt their practices and enhance their farming systems to increase drought resilience.” Melissa Price said.

The objective of the program is to fund activities that support adoption of proven and existing Australian and/or internationally generated research and development practices and technology that:

Broom, Jane: Came to Southern Cross in 1900 and married Jim Broom in 1902. Jim worked on the Jacoletti mine where water was rationed to one kerosene tin per day. Jane made her own furniture and raised a family. During the 1920's they moved to Ghooli where Jim worked on the Water Supply until retirement. The family then moved back to Southern Cross where the girls married local men. As a mark of Jane's respect in the community, she had the honour of opening Pioneer Cemetery memorial wall during the 1970's. True pioneer to the end she is one of the oldest inmates at Southern Cross cemetery aged 98 years. Descendants (Liddle family) still reside here.


