CHOOSE HEALTHY SNACKS

The time between meals can be a danger zone in our efforts to eat healthy. Hunger, boredom or stress can draw us towards quick and unhealthy snacks.

Many snack choices are high in added sugar, saturated fat and salt, and contribute a lot more kilojoules than we think. For example, a café style muffin has 10 teaspoons of sugar and the same number of kilojoules as a small meal.

SNACK SMARTER



▲ **Have a drink of water first.** You may actually be thirsty!



▲ **Craving something sugary?** Reach for fruit – it's naturally sweet and filling.



▲ **Keep snacks like nuts, fruit, crackers and tuna handy.** This will make it easier to resist the temptation of the vending machine.



▲ **Feel like a muffin?** Grab some fruit bread with reduced-fat ricotta cheese and chopped up bananas or strawberries instead.



▲ **Instead of a muesli bar, opt for untoasted muesli and yoghurt.** Top with fruit for extra sweetness and colour.



▲ **Fancy some potato chips?** Munch on plain popcorn instead.



▲ **Make better take-away choices.** When grabbing a snack on-the-run go for sushi, rice paper rolls, fruit or a wrap.



▲ **Fancy a sausage roll?** Try a cheese, tomato and egg toastie.

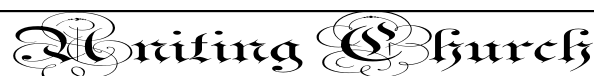

Speak up about substandard rentals

Western Australia's rental market has never been tighter, but it doesn't mean tenants should accept living in homes that are falling into disrepair, have mould or electrical safety issues.

So far this year, Consumer Protection has received 367 enquiries and 32 complaints about rental repair and maintenance issues, but we suspect these figures are only a small proportion of the actual number of tenants experiencing such problems currently.

Due to the low vacancy rates, we are concerned some tenants may feel trapped in substandard properties and afraid to voice their concerns out of fear of being unable to find another place to live.

While we understand these anxieties, we still urge tenants to learn about their rights or contact us so that we may try to help them resolve the problems.

Landlords are duty-bound to promptly attend to any maintenance or repair issues, as well as to provide a safe and healthy environment for their tenants.

We are concerned to see electrical hazards listed among some of the issues reported to us. If tenants experience any shocks, tingles or other serious electrical safety issues in their rental home, they should immediately contact their network operator (likely either Western Power or Horizon Power) before alerting their landlord, property manager or other government agencies like Consumer Protection or Building and Energy.

Harmful black mould is another health hazard to watch-out for, particularly as we head into the wetter months. A landlord could be in breach of a rental agreement if mould develops due to a lack of maintenance or repairs, while a tenant could be in breach if they fail to keep the property reasonably clean, dry and well ventilated.

Tenants facing repair or maintenance issues that could cause them harm or undue hardship are reminded they can breach the landlord for failing to carry out [urgent or essential repairs](#). If the matter goes to court, tenants may be released from their rental contract obligations and even be awarded compensation.

Tenants who believe their landlord or agent has failed to initiate repairs or maintenance within a reasonable timeframe are urged to contact Consumer Protection on consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or by calling 1300 30 40 54.

Have your say: sport participation survey now open

All Australians are invited to have their say on the development of the nation's first codesigned National Sport Participation Strategy through an online survey.

The Strategy aims to transform the way sport participation is connected, delivered and supported in Australia and is being facilitated by the Australian Sports Commission in partnership with sector stakeholders.

The survey covers a range of areas including the challenges participants face, behavioural trends at grassroots levels and what the investment priorities should be in the coming years.

Head of Operations at Creating Chances Assmaah Helal is part of the [17-member Project Steering Group \(PSG\)](#) appointed to guide the development of the Strategy.

She has been leading, advocating, and driving sport for social change and youth development initiatives in Australia and the Asia-Pacific since 2009 and is encouraging as many people as possible to complete the survey.

"It is critical that we hear from a wide range of voices from across the sport industry. You could be working in sport, involved in sport yourself or be a sporting parent," Helal said, who's a keen footballer, cyclist and martial artist.

"We want to know what you think about participating in sport, what motivates you and any barriers you might face to getting involved in sport."

ASC CEO and PSG member Kieren Perkins OAM said participating in sport had many personal and community benefits.

"We know Australians value sport and by taking part in the short survey, you will be contributing to a collective effort to create a more active and healthy Australia through sport."

"Sport needs to be more open and inclusive and we need to ensure that we are providing more opportunities for all Australians to be involved in sport in whatever role they choose."

The survey will take approximately 10 minutes to complete and closes at **5pm on Friday 16 June 2023.**

[National Sport Participation Strategy Roadshows](#) are currently being hosted across the country in partnership with State and Territory governments to consult with key stakeholders.

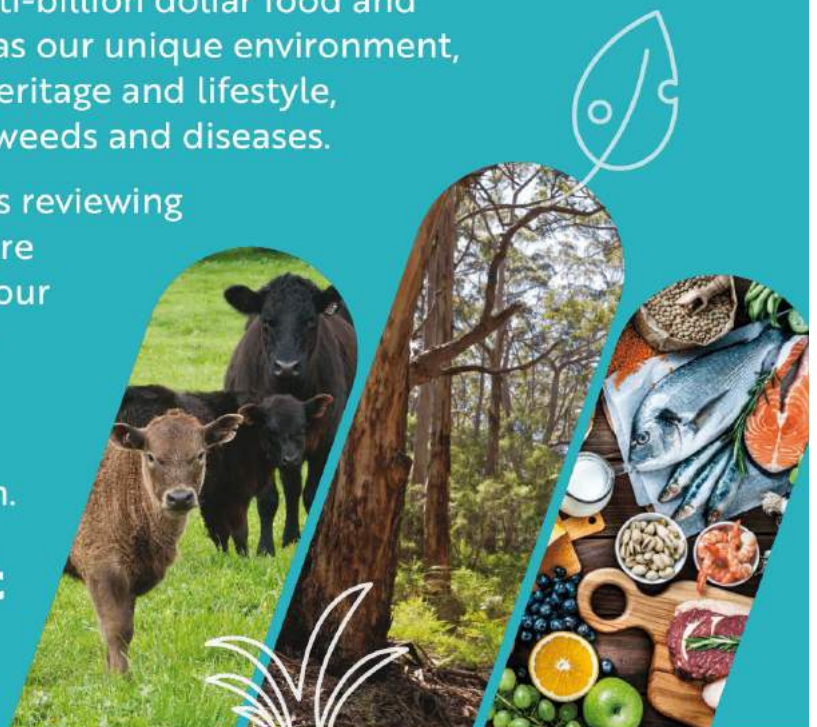

Pioneers of Yilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Finnerty, Michael John: Finnerty arrived in May 1889 to take up the post of Warden and Magistrate Southern Cross. It was the start of his association with the Eastern Goldfields where he became a household name.

Finnerty's background in the Kimberley as police inspector and mine warden stood him in good stead to dispense justice. A born leader he became the leading official at Southern Cross and his decisions were rarely disputed. His four years helped shape the town, his marriage to local girl Bertha Oats being the first held in the new Anglican Church.

In 1893 he was sent to Coolgardie which had grown more important than Southern Cross, returning periodically to conduct magisterial court hearings. Respected and almost worshiped by the diggers, Finnerty became the most influential person throughout the goldfields in coming years, his rulings on the contentious issue of alluvial gold being accepted by all to become enshrined in law.
