NOTICE OF PUBLIC ADVERTISEMENT OF FORM 1 -

RENEWABLE ENERGY FACILITY (WIND FARM)

The Shire has received a DAP Form 1 application proposing a renewable energy facility on various lots located approximately 12 kilometres to the south east of the Southern Cross townsite.

Ten wind turbines are proposed on Lot 620, Lot 622 (No 282) Glendower Road, Lot 231 and 640. The lots are located between Great Eastern Highway to the north, Emu Fence Road to the east, and Southern Cross Marvel Loch Road to the west.

The application proposes up to 10 wind turbines, up to 10 MWh of battery storage, and associated infrastructure including transformers, above and below ground cabling, roads, crane hardstands, switch rooms and communication equipment.

The combined blade length and tower height of turbines will have a maximum height of 240m Above Ground Level (AGL).

The application will be determined by a Development Assessment Panel (DAP) and the Shire is advertising the application for public comment.

Details of the application including technical reports on noise, aviation and visual impact can be viewed on the Shire's website.

Written submissions may be made on the proposal by close of business on the 19th day of October 2023, Submissions can be posted to the Shire of Yilgarn, PO Box 86, Southern Cross WA 6426 or emailed to rso@yilgarn.wa.gov.au

Community Funding Program 2023 / 2024

The "Community Funding Program" has now opened for applications in the 23/24 funding round.

Objectives of the funding project are:

- To provide a source of funding for non-profit community organisations operating within the district.
- To assist community organisations in maximising their future development.
- To provide an impartial means by which community organisations can access Council funds.

Applications for the following categories are invited:

A - Essential equipment/capital items (up to \$2,000)

Types of equipment:

- Ground maintenance equipment
- Sporting equipment
- Office equipment
- Minor plant equipment

B - Community / Sporting Event related expenses (up to \$2,000)

Funding is available for event related expenses to help cover for, but not limited to, guest speakers, facilitators and other event hire costs. Written quotes must be provided at the time of application.

C - Training & Travel Assistance for local officials/office bearers (up to \$500) Funding is available to officials and/or office bearers of community organisations who are required to attend regional / state association organised seminars / courses / meetings as part of their duties. Knowledge gained at these activities must then be used to assist the local community organisation in its continued development.

Eligibility

To be eligible the applicant must be based in the Shire of Yilgarn and meet the following criteria:

- Funding is available for activities which will provide benefits directly to the people of the Shire of Yilgarn.
- Only non-profit community organisations operating within the Shire of Yilgarn are eligible to apply.
- Organisations that have failed to acquit funding from the last round by 30 June 2023 will not be eligible for this round of the funding program.

Bushfires Act 1954

Notice to all Owners & Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Yilgarn

Requirements to Clear Firebreaks

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33(1) of the Bush Fires Act you are hereby required to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn or other-wise clear firebreaks on all land owned or occupied by you by 1 November 2023 and thereafter to keep these firebreaks clear of all flammable material until 31 March 2024. Firebreaks are required in locations and to the specifications detailed below.

LAND WITHIN TOWNSITES

- (a) On land not exceeding 2023 square metres in area, all flammable material shall be removed.
- (b) On land exceeding 2023 square metres in area, a firebreak 3 metres wide shall be constructed inside and immediately adjoining all external boundaries.
- (c) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately surrounding all buildings.
- (d) Haystacks must not be located more than 20 metres to an external boundary. They shall be surrounded by a 10 metre wide firebreak situated between 10 and 20 metres distance from stack.
- (e) Stored fuel, oil and flammable materials shall be protected from fire as prescribed in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961 and the Flammable Liquids Regulations 1967.

RURAL LAND

- (a) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately inside and adjoining all property boundaries.
- (b) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately surrounding all buildings.
- (c) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed between 10 and 20 metres distance from and surrounding all haystacks.
- (d) Stored fuel, oil and flammable materials shall be protected from fire as prescribed in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961 and the Flammable Liquids Regulations 1967 and which include that a firebreak 6 metres wide will be provided immediately surrounding storage areas.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS DURING HARVEST AND RELATED ACTIVITIES

- (a) A minimum of 600 litres of water to be kept onsite at all times during harvest or related activities; and
- (b) By the 2024/2025 summer fire season, all minimum water requirements are to be carried by a motorised vehicle **OR** a trailer that is <u>connected</u> to a motorised vehicle <u>at all times</u> and is able to be deployed immediately

GENERAL

If for any reason it is considered by the owner or occupier of land that it is impractical to comply with the requirements of this notice, a request may be made to Council to approve alternative fire protection measures. Such application shall be accompanied by a sketch or drawing of the proposed variations and should be lodged at the Council offices no later than 31 October 2023.

Where approval of a proposed variation is not granted by Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. The penalty for non-compliance with this notice is a maximum of \$5,000 and notwithstanding prosecution; Council may enter on the land and carry out the requisite works at the owner / occupiers expense.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING TIMES

Restricted Burning Period: 19 September 2023 to 31 October 2023 and 16 February 2024 to 31 March 2024

(Note: Permits to burn during this period are required. Permits must be obtained from your nearest Bush Fire Control Officer)

Prohibited Burning Period: 1 November 2023 to 15 February 2024

(Note: Permits to burn stubble from the previous seasons crop will not be issued until 1 March 2024)





Although holding off until the expedition finished, he spent a year in hospital and never fully recovered. His main claim to fame is writing a book on the party's exploits, which has become invaluable for historians. It was men like Greaves who built this State in the early years.



CAHDS PARENT AND SIBLING WORKSHOPS 2023 Term 4

The Complex Attention Hyperactivity Disorders Service (CAHDS) are offering a series of parent workshops. These workshops are intended for parents with children/adolescents who experience significant attention difficulties, including a diagnosis of ADHD. These workshops are collaborative and invite discussion from participants.

All workshops are stand-alone, and parents can attend any of the workshops upon registration, although numbers are limited for each workshop. Our parent workshops will be run Online from approximately 10:00am - 1.00pm and details regarding access will be sent to parents prior to each session. There is no cost to attend these workshops. Our Sibling workshop will be offered as an expression of interest (numbers permitting) for a face-to-face group at Perth Children's Hospital on a day during the school holidays.

Prior to the beginning of each school term (February, April, July, and October) CAHDS will send out a timetable of the information sessions available for the following three-month period. Social connectedness is integral to wellbeing. People are defined by their social roles, whether as partners, parents, children, friends, caregivers, teammates, staff or employers, or many other roles. We are connected by the way we communicate with others, including our use of social media and technologies. Communication skills, both verbal and written, are needed for individuals to build and maintain relationships with others. Developmental language difficulties/disorders and specific learning difficulties/disorders are common in individuals diagnosed with ADHD but are often undiagnosed. Difficulties can lead to or be a part of attentional, behavioural, emotional, and academic difficulties.	Thursday 9 th November

Emotional Dysregulation	Presented by CAHDS Clinicians Emotional dysregulation is a term used to describe an emotional response that is poorly regulated and does not fall within the traditionally accepted range of emotional reaction. In short it is when our level of emotions outstrips our ability to manage them or utilise the strategies previously employed to manage them – we are emotionally overwhelmed. Participants will be given information to help them identify some of the possible drivers for their child's behaviour. The session encourages discussions guided by topics such as: - What is meant by behaviour? What is the behaviour communicating? Goals of misbehaviour. The use of punishment vs consequences At the end of the session, it is hoped participants gain a better understanding of the reasons for their child's behaviour so as to help their child achieve their need/goals for now and into the future, rather than being given a list of generic behaviour management strategies. 

Be breast aware this October!



October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

so it's an important time to shine a light on the impact that breast cancer has on many Australians. It's also important for people to get to know common breast cancer symptoms.

Women from regional Western Australia (WA) are known to delay going to a medical clinic when they were experiencing symptoms, with many experiencing self-doubt about the existence of the symptom. In 2019, 1,899 women in WA were diagnosed with breast cancer, and 259 women lost their lives to it.

If you're unsure about a possible symptom, you should make an appointment to discuss the change with your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker as soon as possible. This is particularly important if it's been more than four weeks since you first noticed the change. Cancer treatments have improved in recent years, and it is much easier to successfully treat breast cancer if it is found early. The more it spreads, the harder it is to treat. So, we must Find Cancer Early.

Everyone's breasts are different. It is important that you get to know what your breasts look and feel like, so you know what is normal for you. There is no right or wrong way to check your breasts.

Common symptoms of breast cancer include:

- A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side
- A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast
- Change in the look of your breast, including redness, rash, or your skin looks like the skin of an orange, or is wrinkling in small folds
- Changes to the nipple, like it's pulled inwards, leaking, itchy or has a sore that won't heal
- Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it is only on one side
- An area of the breast that feels different to the rest

You can give yourself the best chance to Find Cancer Early, by going to see a doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away if you have any of the symptoms above. The benefits to Finding Cancer Early is that treatment is easier, and you can be around longer to do the things you love doing with the people you love.

Common symptoms:



Lumps and bumps

A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side.



Unusual dimpling or rashes

Change in the look of your breast, like: your skin looks like the skin of an orange, your skin looks and feels different in one area, redness or rash.



Changes to the nipple

Changes to the nipple, like: it's pulled inwards, leaking, itchy or has a sore that won't heal.



Pain or swelling

Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it is only on one side.



A change in size

A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast.

Get to know your breasts and what is normal for you. If you notice any of these symptoms or unusual changes, talk to a doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker without delay.

If you have a symptom, it does not mean you have breast cancer. Often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. However, it is important to get these symptoms or any unusual changes in your body checked out just in case.

Some More History of The Noongaar School

I was the first teacher to open Noongaar School in the Hall which had been moved there from Wheatley near Southern Cross. When a teacher was needed in 1935 I was approached by the District School Inspector and asked if I would open the school there, during that year and about the middle of the year. As I had not any teaching experience, I had to attend Bodallin school each day for one term and was instructed in the work and had to work at the school as a junior teacher.

Mr Robinson's article is quite right in saying that local families had to board the teacher and also raise some money to pay her, as Noongaar was an Assisted School, the parents had to assist with some payment towards the teacher's salary. I was at the school there and boarded with Mrs West for several months and then with Mrs Dean to the end of the term. I resigned then as I had applied to go to Teachers College in the following year—1936. I do not remember the names of all the children that I taught at Noongaar but some of the children were Lionel Birtles, Basil Birtles, Cynthia Dean and John West.

I remember teaching in the hall and had to clear everything away on Friday afternoons as the hall was used for dances on Saturdays and I completed one term (3rd term) in those days and another farm girl was approached to carry on teaching in 1936.

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
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
