THE STATE TRADING CONCERNS ACT, 1916.

North-West Department,
Perth, 17th November, 1943.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 28 of the State Trading Concerns Act, 1916, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of August, 1917, the 13th day of February, 1920, the 23rd day of April, 1920, and the 30th day of June, 1922.

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations as made and in force under the State Trading Concerns Act, 1916, are amended by adding thereto after regulation 29, new regulations as follows:—

Welfare Committees.

30. (1) At any time and from time to time with the approval of the Minister controlling a State trading concern, the employees of such State trading concern may appoint a Welfare Committee. (2) The Welfare Committee shall consist of employees elected by the employees and shall consist of such number of members as the Minister may approve: Provided that each department of the State trading concern shall be entitled to elect at least one employee in such department to be a member of the Committee. (3) The members of the Committee shall hold office for one year from the date of their election, but shall be eligible for re-election. (4) If by reason of death, termination of employment, resignation or other cause, a member of the Committee vacates his seat thereon, another employee in the department of the State trading concern in which the employee ceasing to be a member of the Committee is or was employed shall be elected as a member of the Committee in his place but shall hold office only for the unexpired portion of the term of the member whose place he takes as aforesaid.

31. The election of members of a Welfare Committee appointed under the authority of regulation 30 hereof shall be held and conducted under and in accordance with rules to be made by such Welfare Committee: Provided that—(i) Any such rules shall not have any force or effect until approved by the Minister controlling the State trading concern in which the Committee is appointed; and (ii) In relation to the first Welfare Committee appointed in any State trading concern for the first time after this regulation comes into force, the election of the members of such Committee shall be held and conducted under and in accordance with rules to be made by the Minister controlling the State trading concern in which the said Committee is appointed on the recommendation of a Committee of employees to be nominated by the Minister for the purpose of considering and advising the Minister in relation to such rules.

32. (1) The purposes for which a Welfare Committee may be appointed shall be to establish, maintain, conduct and carry on, in and upon or about the premises of the State trading concern a canteen, cafeteria or refreshment room and such other amenities as may in any way benefit or be of advantage to such employees in the course of their employment in the State trading concern. (2) The Welfare Committee may, for the purposes aforesaid, do such acts, matters and things as are in its opinion necessary or convenient or expedient and which are not unlawful and will not involve the State trading concern in any expenditure of money which the Minister controlling such State trading concern is not willing that it should bear or assume, and in particular without in any way affecting or limiting the generality of this paragraph the Welfare Committee may do all or any of the following things:—(a) Enter into any agreements with the Minister controlling the State trading concern in relation to the exercise by the Welfare Committee of any of its powers under these regulations. (b) Employ and engage servants and agents for carrying on any canteen, cafeteria, refreshment room or other amenity established by the Committee. (c) Receive and expend money for and in connection with any of its undertakings as such Committee. (d) Acquire and occupy, whether as owner, lessee or tenant, any building or premises or place which it requires for or in connection with any of its undertakings aforesaid. (e) Purchase, hire, rent or otherwise acquire any goods, chattels, articles, effects, or things, and sell or otherwise dispose of any such goods, chattels, articles, effects, or things. (f) Subject to the approval of the Minister make any rules for or in connection with its own proceedings, and for and in connection with the establishment, maintenance or carrying on of any of its undertakings aforesaid. (g) Where any moneys are for the time being held by the Committee and are not immediately required for the purposes of the Committee, invest such moneys in any investment authorised by law for the investment of trust moneys.

33. (1) Every agreement entered into and all rules made by a Welfare Committee under the authority of these regulations shall be binding upon and against each one and all of the members of the Committee, and all the employees of the State trading concern in which the Committee is appointed and upon all other persons to whom the provisions of such agreement or of such rules relate or are applicable. (2) Every agreement entered into by a Welfare Committee may be entered into in the name of the Welfare Committee, but shall be executed by each and every one of the individual members thereof, and shall be binding upon and may be enforced against the Welfare Committee, notwithstanding that some of the individual members who executed the agreement have ceased to be members of the Welfare Committee and persons who did not execute the agreement have subsequently become and are members of the Welfare Committee.

34. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained elsewhere in these regulations—(a) The Minister controlling a State trading concern and such State trading concern shall not in any way be responsible for and incur any liability in respect of any liability assumed or loss or damage suffered by a Welfare Committee or in respect of any loss, damage or injury sustained by any servant or agent employed or engaged by a Welfare Committee for or in connection with any of its undertakings under the authority of these regulations, save and except insofar as the Minister may accept any such responsibility or liability by an agreement entered into by him with the Welfare Committee; and (b) Subject to any agreement aforesaid, the Welfare Committee, and each and every member for the time being and from time to time thereof shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Minister controlling the State trading concern and the State trading concern from and against all claims, actions, suits and demands by any person whomsoever arising out of any act, matter or thing done or purported to have been done by the Welfare Committee under the authority of these regulations.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Yilgarn Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Yilgarn.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1942, and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly. A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a bush fire brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such brigade is established, the brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct

all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members, (b) Fire fighting members, and (c) Associate members. (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade at the following rates:—(i) owner or occupier of land within the brigade area—minimum subscription of 10s., (ii) other persons—a minimum subscription of 5s. 0d. (3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws. (4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws. (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board. (6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. Officers will meet monthly on the second Friday in the month.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1942, were passed by a resolution of the Yilgarn Road Board (a Local Authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Southern Cross on 8th October, 1943.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937-1942.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to declare, under section 9 of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1942, that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in the following Road Districts during the periods mentioned:—Balingup Road District, Greenbushes Road District, Preston Road District—8th December, 1943, to 7th March, 1944 (inclusive); Bridgetown Road District—8th December, 1943, to 1st March, 1944 (inclusive). This declaration cancels the notification which appeared in the Government Gazette of 22nd October, 1943, insofar as it affects the abovementioned road districts.

Such poisonings and the fumigating and/or ploughing-in of burrows and such other means of systematic destruction of rabbits shall be continued as directed by this Board's Inspector. This notice is final: failure to comply with

above order renders prosecution liable without any further notice or warning.
