Shire Staff

The Shire of Yilgarn employs 36 full-time staff and 14 part-time and casual staff.

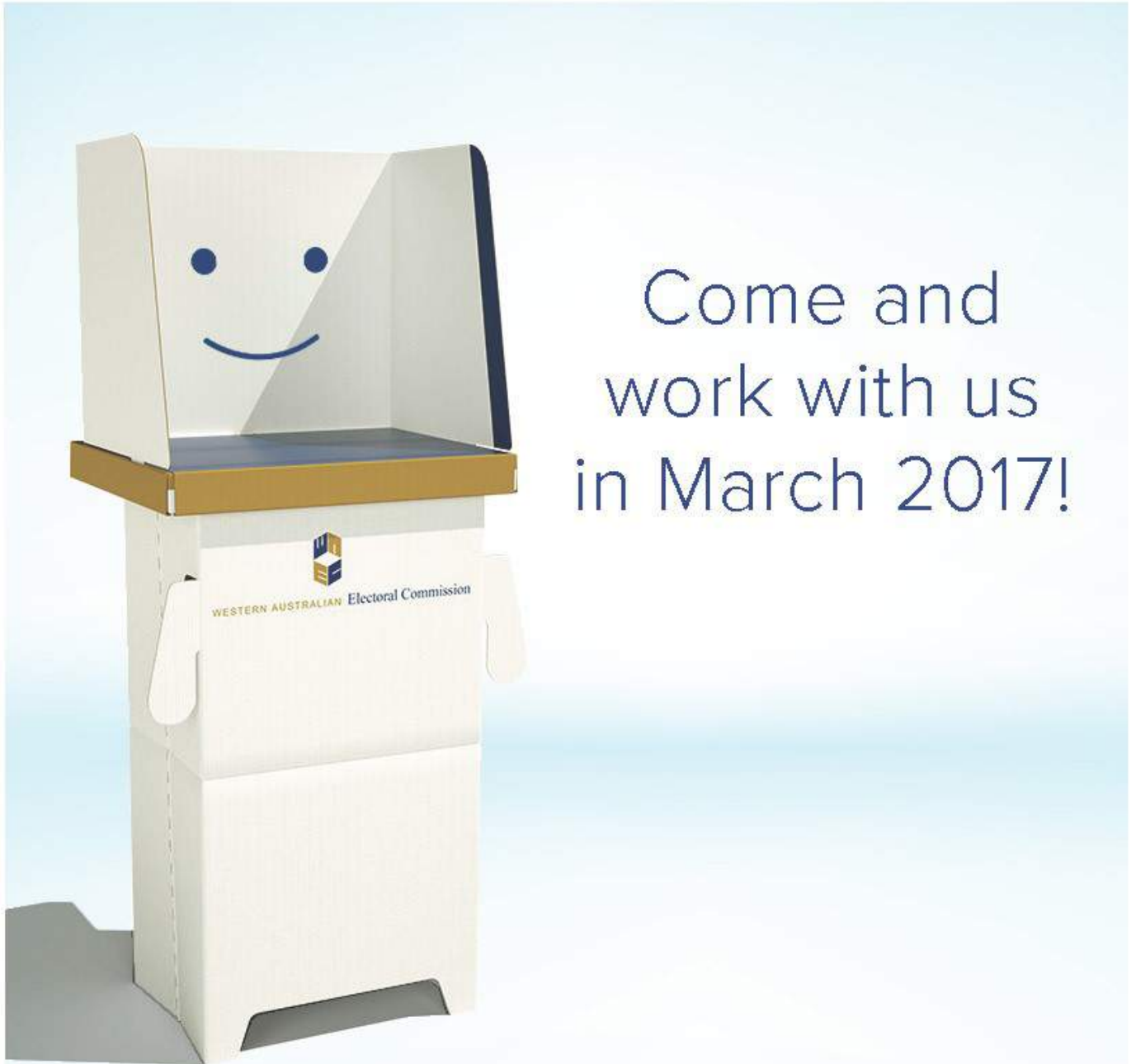

Hanking Gold Mining to undertake drilling at its Golden Pig mine

Hanking Gold Mining (Hanking) will be conducting drilling at its Golden Pig mine adjacent to Southern Cross in the near future. Drilling will be in close proximity to Three Boys Road and will involve several stages over the next couple of months. The first stage will be RC drilling only on a single day shift basis. At a later stage diamond drilling will commence on a 24-hour double shift.

Hanking has taken measures to minimize the impact on members of the public. Land disturbances will be rehabilitated when the work has been completed. Hanking has also put in place the following practices to minimize the potential for noise and dust disturbance to the surrounding area:

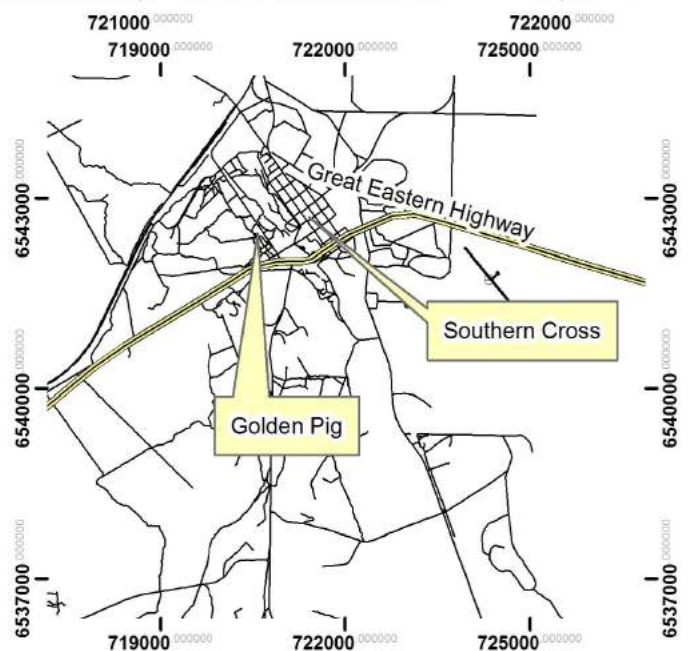
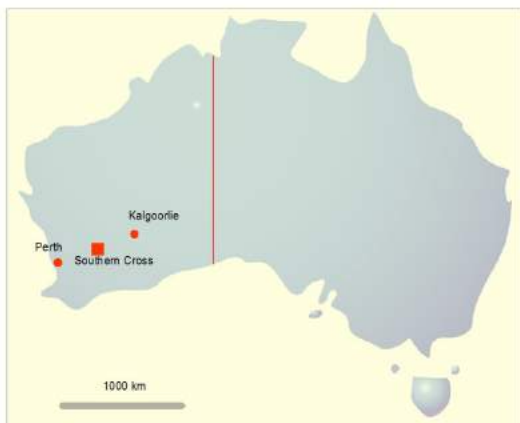
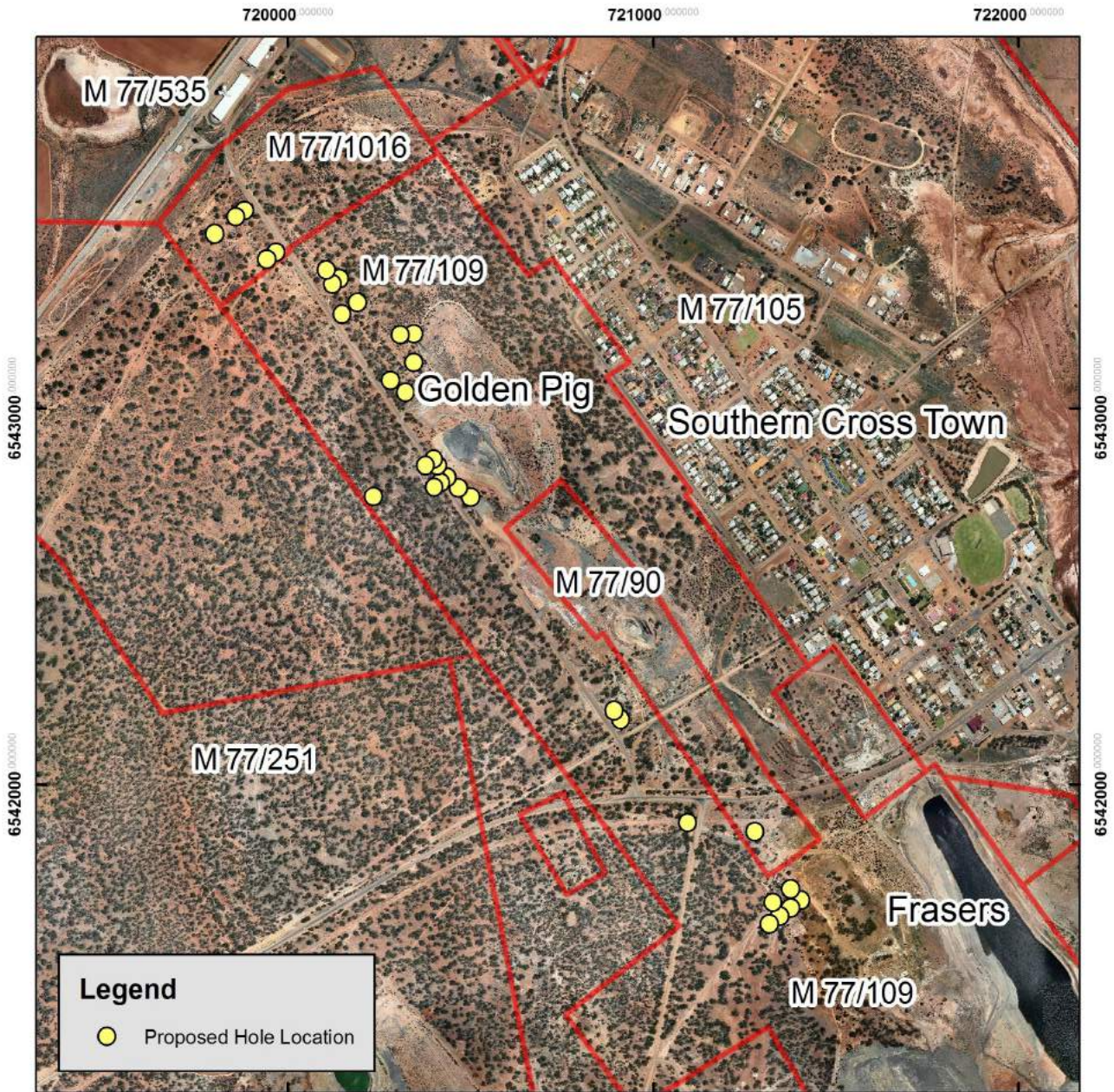

February is Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

- Ovarian cancer is the growth of abnormal cells in one or both ovaries. Left untreated, ovarian cancer can spread to other parts of the body.
- Ovarian cancer is the 9th most common cancer affecting women in Australia and the leading cause of gynaecological cancer deaths in Australia. Each year in Australia, approx. 1300 women are diagnosed with ovarian cancer approx. 1000 women die.
- 70% of women with ovarian cancer are diagnosed at an advanced stage of disease.
- Only 40% women with ovarian cancer survive five years beyond their diagnosis.

Risk factors

- Getting older: women over 50 are more likely to develop ovarian cancer than younger women (average age at diagnosis is 63). However, ovarian cancer can affect women of all ages.
- Inheriting a faulty gene (gene mutation) increases the risk of ovarian cancer.
- Having a strong family history of ovarian cancer, breast cancer, or some other cancers, including bowel and endometrial cancer. It is important to remember that only around 5-10% of all ovarian cancers are due to inherited factors.
- Endometriosis, when the tissue lining of the uterus (the endometrium) is found outside the uterus.
- Hormonal factors such as early puberty, late menopause or the long-term use of hormone replacement therapy (HRT).
- Your risk of ovarian cancer is increased if you smoke, are overweight or obese, don't exercise, drink alcohol or have a poor diet.

Symptoms

Ovarian cancer can be difficult to diagnose in its early stages as symptoms can be non-specific or similar to those of other diseases. Symptoms include:

- A swollen, bloated abdomen.
- Pressure, discomfort or pain in the abdomen.
- Heartburn, nausea and bloating.
- Changes in toilet habits (e.g. constipation, diarrhoea, frequent urination due to pressure, increased flatulence).
- Tiredness and loss of appetite.
- Unexplained weight loss or weight gain.
- Changes in your menstrual pattern or postmenopausal bleeding.
- Pain during sex.



It is important to know these symptoms, but it is equally important to know ovarian cancer often develops without symptoms. What's more, having these symptoms does not mean you have ovarian cancer, as they may be caused by other conditions. However, if you do have any of these symptoms you should see your doctor as soon as possible.

Farmsafe Safety is everyone's business

Many of us have had a 'close call' during our time at work – this can be magnified when working alone, at heights and with both sophisticated and also basic machinery which is the norm on many farms.

Farmsafe WA Alliance urges the farming industry and any visitors to farms to continue to "Think safe" and look for risky situations before acting during busy times and also at school holiday periods as many of accidents and fatalities seem to occur during school holiday periods.

It is important to note that risky and difficult situations can arise when the workplace – 'the farm' - is the same location as the family home and play areas for children. It appears that many of the tragic accidents that have occurred in the past might have been prevented.



Farmsafe WA Chairman Mike Norton said "On farm safety should never be underestimated. It needs to be front of mind at all times."

Mr Norton added "We urge people not to rush jobs and to be always thinking ahead about what might happen – particularly if you are on a quad bike or tractor and if you are unsure of terrain."

The Farmsafe WA Alliance focus will continue to be on supporting the agriculture and food industry and service providers to the industry and we will continue to campaign for and on behalf of farm safety. There were less deaths in Western Australia in 2016 than other states, however even one fatality is one too many !

Mr Norton added "Death and injury on country roads and farms are a huge burden to all those directly affected – including family and friends and even the local ambulance volunteers. We all need to take personal responsibility to keep our farms and communities injury free"

Providing a safe workplace is an important and integral part of doing business on farms – and it is most importantly for everyone to realise its legislation. Farmsafe WA Alliance are continuing to work hard to provide effective solutions that are easy to implement and not complex.

"As an industry and globally Western Australians farmers are leaders in production and innovation in agriculture, it makes sense that we can also lead in regards to farm safety." Mr Norton added
