Standpipes

The Shire of Yilgarn is to undertake a review of standpipes across the shire as the current system operates at a significant loss each year and the Water Corporation is reviewing the charge fee for high locations with the intent of imposing commercial rates or controlling flow rates.

Users of the standpipes are urged to use the recording process for water taken as unrecorded use becomes a cost to the community which is unfair and unjust.

The current charge out rate used by the Shire does not cover the costs of water, data collection and invoicing and these will be reviewed to achieve cost recovery. There can be no profit margin in water charges from standpipes.

Water used for fire-fighting purposes can be fully recouped from the Water Corporation if records are kept or Council can opt to meet this cost as a community service.

With any service provided on an honour system there is a high dependency on user integrity and people/companies accessing the standpipes should meet the recording requirements.

A review will also be conducted of the number and location of standpipes with a view to rationalising if practical

Swipe readers will be considered in the 2018/19 budget for high use standpipes (3 are currently operating).

THE BEVERLEY SOARING SOCIETY VISITS SOUTHERN CROSS

From 4th to 15th December the Beverley Soaring Society will be visiting Southern Cross on their ninth annual visit, or Southern Cross Expedition. The first visit was in 2007, ten years ago.

The gliding conditions in Southern Cross can be spectacular and 2013 was our best year ever. Two of our pilots completed the first flights in excess of 1000 km, the first ever such flights in Western Australia for their Standard Class Gliders. They flew from Southern Cross to Brookton then up to Morawa and back to Southern Cross. Greg Beecroft achieved an average speed of 120.73 kph which set two Australia records as well as a number of Western Australian records.

Unfortunately the following visits have not been so successful but gliders pilots are optimists and live in hope for the "Day of Days".



In 2017 we will have 13 gliders visiting Southern Cross with over 20 pilots. They will be launched by one of Beverley's towplanes as pictured above. Like all gliding towplanes, VH-BMF started life as a crop duster or sprayer and was later converted to a gliding towplane by stripping out all the agricultural gear and adding a special tow hook and release capability.

The first flying day will be Tuesday 5th December and the last flying day will be Friday 15th December. Provided the weather conditions are reasonable the fleet of gliders will be launched between about 11 am and noon each day and will return late in the afternoon. Each day a different task is set and the pilots will fly distances governed by their skill and experience.

Often flights will be triangles of between 300 and 500 km and on spectacular days, when the gliders can be over 15,000 ft above the ground even longer flights will be attempted. Last year there were some flights in excess of 750 km.



Again the Beverley Soaring Society is also bringing up one of the Club's two seater gliders so that they can take members of the Southern Cross Aero Club and interested members of the local community for flights. A glider flight would typically last 30 minutes and the price has been discounted from the normal level of \$195 to \$180 for the Southern Cross expedition. If you wish to book a flight call the Booking Officer Roger Shead on **0407 385 361** and he will help you. We can fly a visitor on most days in the DG1000S glider which is pictured below:

Shed the chains of addiction in the New Year

Every January 1, people all over the world make New Year's resolutions. If you are smoker, why not make a resolution to quit smoking? Smoking is still number one cause of preventable death and disease in Australia. Quitting smoking can cut your risk of diseases and save more than \$10000 in a year, that's double benefit. Why not buy a nice car or treat your family with a holiday trip from this saving.

The negative effects of smoking are always overlooked due to the fact that they are not immediately visible compared to alcohol and drug users. Tobacco smoke contains more than 7000 chemicals, including tar, nicotine, carbon monoxide, hydrogen cyanide, metals, radioactive compounds and pesticides. At least 70 chemicals are known to cause cancer. Smoking can cause 16 types of cancer, heart diseases, lung diseases, eye diseases, problems in pregnancy, premature wrinkles and low fertility.

Quitting smoking can be challenging. Most people make multiple quit attempts. That's because nicotine is a very addictive drug. But don't give up trying just because you haven't succeeded in the past. Research has shown that smokers on average make 12-14 quit attempts before quitting for good. Think about your past attempts to quit—what worked and what didn't. If one method didn't work, don't hesitate to try another method. You can learn something new every time you try to quit. This time might be a good time for you to quit.

1. **Identify your reasons to quit** – Most common reasons are to improve health and avoid diseases; protect family; save money; and regain confidence and control.
2. **Understand your smoking** – Nicotine withdrawal, habits and routines, stress, social situations and the amount of alcohol you've had, each contribute to the urge to smoke. Together they make quitting a challenge. Understanding your smoking helps to anticipate cravings and plan for your quit attempt.
3. **Choose the best way to quit** – Doctor, nurse or pharmacist can provide information, encouragement and tips on creating your personalised quitting plan. They can assist you with choosing the best medicines to quit. Contact the Tobacco Action Mob at Bega for resources and support. You can also call Quitline on 137848 and use 'My Quit Buddy' smartphone app.
4. **Get ready** – Set a quit date; stay away from smokers; change your routine; practice quitting; take medication regularly as advised; and try eating healthy.

Get up everyday determined not to smoke. Reward yourself from the money saved by not smoking. Come up with a list of small gifts that you can give yourself. Make this the year you quit smoking for good. Shed the chains of addiction and take back your life. You are worth it..

and Skin Cancer as a Workplace Hazard

Australia has one of the highest levels of skin cancer in the world. At least two in every three Australians will develop skin cancer before they reach the age of 70.

The workplace is a major source of exposure for many adult Australians, with outdoor workers receiving between five and ten times more sun exposure than indoor workers. So it is not surprising that outdoor workers who spend long periods of time working in the sun have a higher than average risk of skin cancer.

National Skin Cancer Action Week is coming up and the Cancer Council is offering workplace talks that will discuss cancer prevention (slip, slop, slap, slide & seek), explain how to use the UV index, how to check for skin cancer and how much sun is enough for healthy vitamin D levels. Cancer Council WA can also work with your organisation to implement SunSmart policies to protect employers and employees.

Early detection is an important factor in the positive treatment for all cancers. Recognising the early signs of skin cancer can save a life!

Talks can run for 10-40 minutes depending on how much time is available at your workplace. Information given can be adapted to suit your work environment; indoor or outdoors and can be held at anytime to suit.

Festival and event ticket buying tips

Festivals and events in Perth are an exciting part of summer that many of us here in the Goldfields look forward to whether it is for food, arts and culture, music or sport.

Consumer Protection was part of a national Festivals campaign running over eight weeks until 24 November 2017. The campaign provided consumers with some simple tips to use to avoid being left out-of-pocket by the cancellation of events.

While organisers may do their best, sometimes festivals and events can fail leaving consumers out of pocket.

It's important that consumers understand their rights, and that ticketing agencies understand their responsibilities. If a festival or event doesn't go ahead or changes significantly, consumers can seek a refund and in some cases, compensation for other losses such as flights and accommodation from the company that sold you the ticket.

Refunds may also be available if organisers are unable to provide products or services that are included in the ticket price such as food and beverage packages, or meet and greets.

If something goes wrong and expectations are not met, event organisers and ticketing agents must automatically and promptly offer consumers an appropriate remedy, which can include a full or partial refund.

Promotional material from organisers and ticketing agents should not illegally state 'no refunds', as consumers may be entitled to a refund under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL), including any booking and transaction fees.

We recommend only buying tickets through authorised sellers. Tickets purchased from authorised sellers often restrict their resale or transfer. Promoters and venues also have conditions of entry.

If you buy from an unauthorised seller, you can risk being turned away at the venue. Your rights to a refund or exchange may also be affected if the show is postponed or cancelled.

Other top ticket buying tips include doing your research on the event, reading the terms and conditions before you purchase tickets and buying tickets online through a secure website with a credit card or payment service like PayPal.

Also keep all related documentation and receipts and, if you do buy second hand or resale tickets, then check the venue or event's restrictions on resale tickets.

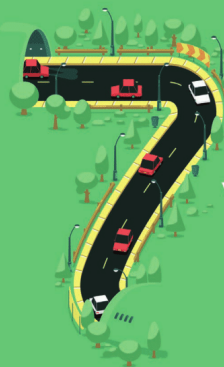

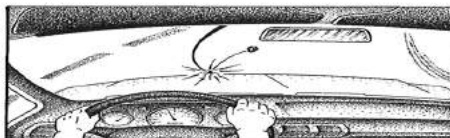
