CALL FOR COMMUNITIES TO NOMINATE THEIR LOCAL MOBILE PHONE BLACKSPOTS Database to be updated to respond to community needs

13 September 2018

The Federal Government is calling on mobile black spot nominations from local, territory and state governments as well as Federal Members of Parliament, to identify locations for the next round of the \$220 million Mobile Black Spot Program.

Round 4 of the program was announced in June this year with the Coalition investing \$25 million to eliminate mobile black spots in regional Australia.

Minister for Regional Services, Senator Bridget McKenzie, said this next round affirms the Coalition's commitment to delivering 21st century communications in the regions and will deliver real benefits for our communities.

"I'm delighted to see the next round of the program coming to fruition. The program is changing lives for so many regional and remote communities across Australia."

"We're taking a targeted approach this time around to deliver a clear economic benefit. We are calling on state, territory and local governments, as well as our parliamentary colleagues, to nominate mobile black spot areas in their region where economic as well as social benefits can be realised," Minister McKenzie said.

"Round 4 will also target improved mobile coverage for medical, educational and emergency services facilities, as well as along key transport routes and in towns that experience seasonal demand due to tourism."

The program has been highly successful with more than 600 of the total 867 base stations already delivered across the country under the first three rounds of the program. More than \$680 million has been generated in co-investment from state and local governments, carriers, businesses and local communities.

McIntosh, William: Pegged the McIntosh mine at Parkers Range in 1888, which developed into the premier mine and biggest employer at the little settlement. He was well sinking at Moorine when Parker rode in to replenish his water.

Suspecting that Parker had found gold, McIntosh back-tracked him for 40 miles to Parker's new discovery and pegged nearby. Not having the money to mine in his own right, McIntosh sold his lease and continued working for wages. He eventually left for Pingelly where he bought a pub.

New guidance on consumer guarantees and the motor vehicle industry

New car fact sheet

New car buyers, including small businesses, can expect to receive a fact sheet that will explain their consumer guarantee rights at the point of purchase. This week, the ACCC released the <u>Just</u> <u>bought a new car?</u> (https://www.accc.gov.au/publications/just-bought-a-new-car) fact sheet which provides information about what consumers can expect and the remedies available if there is a problem with their new car.

Consumer guarantee rights provide remedies to consumers, including small businesses in many circumstances, if their new car experiences a failure. These potential remedies under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL) include:

- a right to a repair (without charge) for a minor failure, or
- a replacement or a full refund of the car for a major failure.

The fact sheet follows the recent ACCC <u>market study</u> (https://www.accc.gov.au/publications/newcar-retailing-industry-market-study-final-report) into the new car retailing industry. This market study found that consumers don't receive adequate information about their automatic consumer guarantees at the point of purchase, and need information that can be referred to at any time during their ownership of their car.

As industry best practice, new car dealers are expected to provide a copy of the fact sheet to consumers at the point of purchase of a new car.

Motor vehicle sales & repairs guide

The ACCC has also published an updated version of the <u>Motor vehicle sales & repairs guide</u>. (https://www.accc.gov.au/publications/motor-vehicle-sales-repairs-an-industry-guide-to-the-australian-consumer-law). This guide addresses issues identified in the market study, including specific guidance on criteria for determining a 'major failure'.

The guide can help authorised dealers, vehicle manufacturers, independent repairers, and other businesses within the industry by providing an in-depth explanation of industry rights and obligations under the ACL.

We have updated this guide in consultation with the state and territory ACL regulators and a number of car manufacturers and industry associations.

5" charm packs may not all be the same size. Try to buy the same brand and not mix brands. Otherwise use your scraps and cut your own 5" squares. Approximately 42 squares in a package.

With Project one you will complete the quilt top in this workshop. If you want to purchase your border etc, fabrics you can do this at a later date and complete the quilt at your own leisure.

With Project two the above fabric requirements make a quilt sized $81'' \times 94''$. If you would prefer to make a lap size quilt you will need 45 x 5'' print squares and 54 x 5'' background squares. If making a cushion top you will need 5 x 5'' print squares and 6 x 5'' background squares. Once again you can purchase your border etc, fabrics and complete the quilt at your own leisure.

Working together towards communities free of suicide

CSBP Fertilisers announces a new community partnership with Lifeline WA to invest in the training of telephone crisis supporters.

Lifeline WA provides people experiencing a personal crisis with access to online, phone and face-to-face crisis support and suicide prevention services.

According to Lifeline WA, one person dies to suicide every day in Western Australia and those in regional areas are at a much greater risk. Limited access to mental health services, increased travel times to get help and a stigma around mental illness in many smaller communities contribute to the higher rates.
