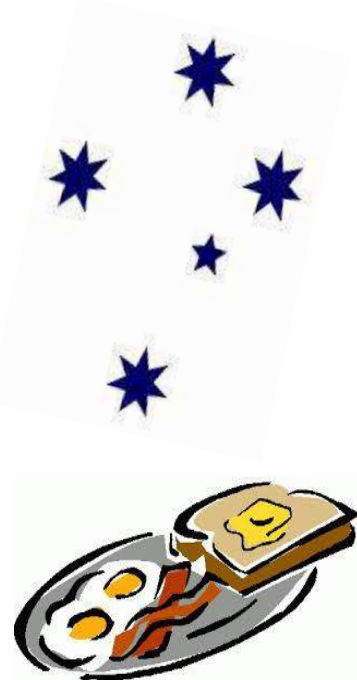

Assessment Criteria:

Preference will be given to landholders who haven't received many/any Shire projects in the past.

- Species must be planted to tackle poor production areas (issues such as salinity, wind erosion, or other 'land degradation matters').
- Saltbush Seedlings will be delivered on-farm during late June/early July 2019. Applicants **must** be able to accept, care for (water every day) and plant seedlings at any time within this period.
- Stock **must** be kept off saltbush seedlings for the first 12 months.

Planting information:

Seedlings should be planted in blocks or belts at 1000 stems/ha depending on soil capacity and layout. There should be barley grass present as indicator that the species will survive on intended site.

Seedling Information:

The Shire of Yilgarn is proposing that a subsidy of 20 cents per seedling be paid by the receiving landholder to help offset the costs involved (each Oldman seedling costs 50 cents). Oldman Saltbush is native to the semi-arid areas of Australia and is well adapted to conditions.

Covalent Lithium Pty Ltd
Earl Grey Lithium Project
11 February 2019 to 11 March 2019

Covalent Lithium Pty Ltd is proposing to develop the Earl Grey Lithium Project, an open-cut lithium mine situated at the previously abandoned Mt Holland Gold Mine located 105 km south of Southern Cross (Shire of Yilgarn). The Project involves open cut mining and processing of lithium ore. The Proposal boundary encompasses 1,984 ha however would require clearing of 392 ha of native vegetation and would use 268 ha of the existing infrastructure and disturbed areas. The additional clearing is predominately required for an expansion of the existing mine pit, waste dumps, Tailings Storage Facility and ancillary infrastructure.

An Environmental Review Document (ERD) has been prepared by the Covalent Lithium Pty Ltd in accordance with Environmental Protection Authority procedures and is released for public review. The ERD describes the proposal, examines the likely environmental effects and the proposed environmental management procedures associated with the proposed development.

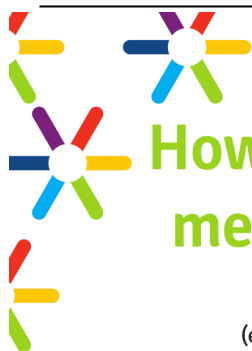

How to access free and low-cost help for a mental health issue in Western Australia

There are many free and low-cost services available for people who have financial difficulties (e.g. unemployed or have a healthcare/concession card). These services can be accessed via any GP.



How a GP can help

By talking with you about what is happening and working with you to determine what support is best for you.

This could include:

- Access to self-help resources, support groups, online support and referrals to community services.
- Setting up a Mental Health Care Plan which can allow you to claim a Medicare rebate for up to six visits to a clinical psychologist, mental health or allied mental health professional.
- Depending on your needs, your GP can also refer you for an additional four sessions if required.

Note: For your first visit, please request a 30-minute appointment.



What happens when a GP bulk bills?

Any GP can refer you to the appropriate services. However, with a bulk billing GP the bill for your appointment is sent directly to Medicare and there will be no out of pocket payment for you.

Not all GPs bulk bill – please ask when you book your GP appointment.



How to access a bulk billing GP?

Anyone who is registered with Medicare and has a Medicare card can access a bulk-billing GP. If you are not enrolled with Medicare, you can complete an enrolment form online or visit your nearest Medicare office.

Know your rights when a salesperson knocks

Recent reports from Perth home owners about bogus door-to-door sellers are a good reminder to make sure you know your rights when a salesperson knocks.

In the past few weeks, people have told us about visits from door-to-door water testers who give the impression they are from the Government and make false claims about water quality, but are really sellers of water filtration systems.

Under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL), you have rights when a salesperson approaches you at your front door. These protections apply to 'unsolicited consumer agreements', such as door-to-door selling and telemarketing.

To weed out sellers making false claims or misrepresenting themselves, always ask for identification. If you think a door-to-door salesperson is using deceptive tactics to drum up business, make a written note of the person's and the company's name, address and telephone number.

Providing identification is just one of the rules door-to-door sellers have to follow about how and when can they approach you and what information they are required to give you.

Door-to-door sellers can only contact you between 9am and 6pm on weekdays and between 9am and 5pm on Saturdays, they must explain the purpose of their visit and they have to provide identification. If you ask a salesperson to leave, they must go immediately.

When you make an agreement with a door-to-door seller, they should provide a copy of the signed contract and disclose your 'cooling off' or termination rights. Under the ACL, you have 10 business days to reconsider an agreement and cancel it without penalty.

If you don't want to deal with uninvited door-to-door sellers, email your full name and postal address to consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au and ask for a "Do not knock" sticker to display on or near your front door.

Telemarketers can only contact you between 9am and 8pm on weekdays and between 9am and 5pm on Saturdays. To opt out of receiving unsolicited telemarketing calls, register your numbers on www.donotcall.gov.au.

Oats, William: Captain Oats came to Southern Cross in December 1889 to manage Frasers South Mine. For a short period he also managed Frasers Mine in addition to Frasers South. Oats was a born leader who served as mayor of Southern Cross for some years.

He influenced the future of the town when it was in its infancy. He then won the inaugural parliamentary seat of Yilgarn when it was created, where he contributed even more to the district.

Over time he served in both the lower and upper houses, elected each time he nominated until retirement fifteen years later. Because of his influence as mayor and parliamentarian, some saw him as the 'father' of Southern Cross.

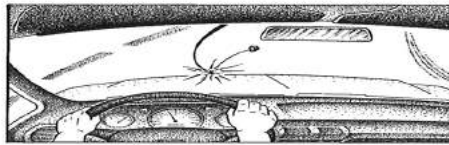
