REDEVELOPMENT

Council at its June 2019 Ordinary meeting considered a Draft Concept Plan for the total redevelopment of the Southern Cross Swimming Pool. In endorsing the Plan, Council has now instructed its Architects to prepare fully costed designs for consideration and presentation to Council and the community for comment.

At the above meeting Council also resolved to allocate an additional \$300,000 in the 2018/2019 Budget to the Recreation Reserve Fund for the Swimming Pool Project. With this injection of funds and also the anticipated contribution to the Reserve Fund in the 2019/2020 Budget, Council should have sufficient funds to meet the total cost for the project.

As an initial discussion point, the Draft Concept Plans are now displayed in the Shire of Yilgarn's Administration Offices for viewing and comments can be made or forwarded to Council's Manager Community Services, Jenny Gemund.



Southern Cross Hospital's "first born" returns to celebrate a 50 year milestone

Officially opening on 30 May 1969, Southern Cross Hospital has recently celebrated its half century milestone with Raelene Blair, the first baby born in the hospital, returning to partake in the anniversary celebrations.

Raelene was the first of 494 babies born in Southern Cross Hospital between 1969 and 2011 when obstetric services ceased.

"I received an official invitation in the mail asking me to celebrate the hospital's anniversary and to cut the cake.

"I'm sentimental at heart and was really chuffed," Ms Blair said.

"I enjoy having an excuse to head to Southern Cross and loved hearing the stories of times past at the celebrations," she added.

Now 91, former Southern Cross Hospital GP Dr Stephen Dale also attended the birthday celebrations and relayed stories from his time when the facility first opened. He even re-met some of the local residents who he had help deliver almost 50 years before.

Approximately 50 people attended the celebrations and were invited on a tour of the hospital.

Diane Dixon, the WA Country Health Service Health Service Manager, Southern Cross said that the hospital had seen a number of changes over its 50 years.

"Carinaville Lodge, our aged care facility, became part of the hospital in 1998 and there are now six permanent residents living there," Mrs Dixon said.

"Two years ago we received an upgraded emergency department including a new resuscitation bay and dedicated consultation rooms for outpatients.

"I work with a wonderful bunch of people, including one employee who has been employed by the hospital for nearly 30 years," she added.

Changes to the Scheme

- The 'first and last mile' special RAV access arrangements have been finalised.
- HMMS will continue, however will revert to its original intent as a mass management scheme.



Access Update

- 1053 roads were endorsed under HMMS Road Lists for the 2018-19 harvest period.
- Onsite assessments are underway with the intent to add these endorsed roads to the relevant RAV Networks prior to the upcoming harvest period.
- This eliminates the need for future special access arrangements under HMMS.



Key Points

- No changes to the HMMS mass provisions.
- Apply for new RAV access early, allowing up to 12 weeks.
- HMMS access is now via RAV Networks or Restricted Local Access Permits.

Harvest Mass Management Scheme

What you need to know for 2019-2020 Harvest Period



Register for HMMS

- If you wish to participate in HMMS, continue to register your vehicles with a participating Grain Receiver.
- Familiarise yourself with the HMMS Business Rules, available on the Harvest Mass Management Scheme page of our website.
- DO NOT submit a HMMS Road List to Main Roads.



New RAV Access

If there are additional roads you need, for an upcoming harvest period, which are not approved for RAV access and you did not apply for them under HMMS last season, you will need to apply to Main Roads to have the roads assessed via the standard RAV application process.



RAV Access Options

- Use a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination that is 20 m or less in length and 50 t or less in gross mass on any road.
- Use a RAV that is greater than a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination on approved RAV Network roads.

Harvest Mass Management Scheme 4 Step Guide

Follow these four steps to ensure you are ready for the 2019-20 HMMS harvest period:

Confirm RAV Network

 Transport operators and farmers needs to ensure all roads they use are approved for the particular RAV combination being used. This information is available on the RAV Mapping Tool. Roads endorsed under a HMMS Road List in 2018-19 will be approved if they meet the minimum safety standards. If the roads requested do not meet the minimum standards, the applicant will be contacted by Main Roads and advised accordingly.

New RAV Access is Required

 If additional roads are required, the transport operator or farmer needs to apply for new RAV access via the standard RAV application process. DO NOT submit a HMMS Road List to Main Roads. Further information and application form is available on the Road Access page of our website.

Register for HMMS

 The transport operator must register their vehicles with a registered Grain Receiver. They should also familairise themselves with the Business Rules available on the Harvest Mass Management Scheme page of our website.


Commence Operating

 Once the roads you require are all approved for the relevant RAV combination being used, your vehicles are registered with a Grain Receiver, and you are familiar with the Business Rules, you are ready to start carting for the harvest season.




