RoadWise at the Show

Yilgarn Agricultural Society Inc. received a community road safety grant from the Road Safety Commission to promote the "Don't trust your tired self" message. It is a very timely and appropriate message, as driver fatigue is reckoned to be responsible for 31% of the Killed and Serious Injury crashes on Wheatbelt roads. These crashes are typified by vehicles running off the road to the left, or veering right into oncoming traffic, with no sign that the driver braked.

What causes fatigue? Working when you would normally be asleep,

being awake for more than 17 hours straight, suffering from medical sleep problems such as sleep apnoea, or accumulated sleep loss, sleep deficit. Particularly at risk are mine-site shift workers, farmers, truck drivers, anyone who works long hours, because after 17 hours awake, activity in the brain decreases. That's why after more than 17 hours awake, the chances of being in a fatigue related crash actually DOUBLE.

At the RoadWise display, road safety advisor Cliff Simpson also engaged with the five likely lads in the picture on the topic of drink driving: while the latest statistics from Police and Main Roads show that fewer drivers are killed or seriously injured while driving drunk, the biggest improvement has been in the 17-19 age bracket.

The lads tried to catch a drinks cooler while wearing Fatal Vision goggles, which give the impression of having a Blood Alcohol Concentration of .07, (above the legal limit to drive.) our eyes become accustomed to the visual distortion of the goggles after a while, and it is a fun activity to prove a point that alcohol makes us lose coordination, but the impairment from drinking alcohol (or using drugs) doesn't wear off so quickly. So if you plan to drink, plan your ride home, organise a skipper, bring your swag, but don't drink and drive.

Visitors to the RoadWise display were also invited to enter a road safety quiz by answering ten questions, such as what is the penalty for using a mobile phone when driving? (Answer: \$400 and 3 demerits... ouch!)

Road safety advisor Cliff Simpson was at hand to discuss the vision of Zero fatalities and serious injuries from traffic crashes. The first name out of the hat was Tommo Martin, who wins a \$50 BP fuel voucher.

Yilgarn Historical Museum Regional Report 14 September 2019

On behalf of the Yilgarn Historical Museum, I would like to welcome you all and thank you for the opportunity to host this year's Regional meeting.

We are fortunate to have the Original Mining Registrar and Courthouse building as the home of the Yilgarn History Museum, opened in 1979. This building, together with the added Blythe pavilion, Carla Della Bosca pavilion and Railway cabin, house our Mining, Agriculture, Early Settlers and Settlement, Aboriginal, Military and Railway and Water history.

We are very proud to have won the Culture and Heritage Award in the 2017 Tidy Towns Competition.

Opening every day, except over the Christmas/New Year period, or when major maintenance has been in progress, we have averaged 30 daily visitors a week over the last 12 months. Not included in the daily figures are the 5 major groups who visit annually: Yilgarn Car and Bike Club, Albany District Alternative school, 25 Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program Students, combined local teacher's group (beginning of every school year), and class groups from Southern Cross District High School, St Joseph's and Moorine Rock schools.

The students of the Albany Alternative School are very rewarding. It is a delight to see them find the "new" displays/objects each year, and to be greeted like long lost friends.

This year the Museum was asked to provide 2 hours of community duty for the Medical Students (divided into 2 groups). I asked each group to list the names and use of all instruments and objects in the Morgue and Apothecary cabinets! The discussions — and use of the iPhones! — was great to hear and see. They all seemed to find the Morgue instruments fascinating! The Co-ordinators have asked that next year's intake of students complete the same exercise.

We frequently have inquiries from members of old pioneering families, plus families of itinerant miners. Our Research Officer, Lance Stevens, is usually able to answer the mostly interesting inquiries. Any added information the "enquirees" are able to share is greatly appreciated.

With the help of community members and Shire personnel, the 7 tonne rock donated with the underground train engine, truck and bogger by the Marvel Lock Gold Mine, has been installed in its permanent position together with its air arm, allowing landscaping with blue metal to be accomplished. At the same time, we have added a display of geraniums around the old school bell.

Two large donations gratefully received this year are of a circa. 1930 chaff cutter made by a local farming pioneer; and a local farmer's collection of very interesting and outstanding rocks collected from the Koolyanobbing, Southern Cross and Marvel Loch areas. We have been able to showcase these rocks in the foundation wall of the new storage shed beautifully.

Our Modernisation and Military displays are ongoing, and are being very well received by our visitors. This year we have concentrated on preservation and restoration of outside "objects"; and the updating of all Mosaic records ready for the possible transference to the Western Australian Collections software program should we decide to do so when it becomes available.

The Farm and Camel drays plus all saddlery, have been oiled and restored by our willing volunteers, and the old red phone box has been transferred to the Blythe Pavilion for preservation. Both a very big job!

We are very fortunate to have a very interested and willing group of volunteers, and a very supportive Shire Council. On behalf of our Committee, I thank everyone very sincerely.



Stage 1. Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Stacey, Jack: Came to Southern Cross in 1895 and got a job as lamplighter and odd job man for the Municipality. In 1910 he took over running the electricity powerhouse which he kept up seven days for many years, being commended frequently for his dedication to the job. Afterwards, he developed a farm near town and became the third largest farmer. He bred the best horses in the district. As a measure of his care for stock, the RSPCA made Jack Stacev honoury veterinarian for this area. He was civic minded and for 18 years served as a town councillor, the last term as Chairman. specialty was the powerhouse, and Southern Cross can thank Jack Stacey for its continued electricity, particularly as the town was too small to make it viable.
